CS 452 Natural Language Processing

3 hours

* Add Course and Catalog Description:

Fundamental algorithms and computational models for core tasks in natural language processing: word and sentence tokenization, parsing, information and meaning extraction, spelling correction, text summarization, question answering and sentiment analysis. PR: CS 215 *and* MTH 220 *or* Instructor consent.
