#### COLLEGE OF EDUCATION & HUMAN SERVICES

ECE 101 Early Childhood Wellbeing 3 hours
An introduction to the basic requirements and regulations for health and safety in early childhood programs serving children from birth to age eight. Co-requisite(s)/Prerequisite(s): None.

ECE 201 Technology Skills for Early Childhood 1 hour This course is designed to develop the skills necessary for an early childhood educator to communicate using technology, to use technology to pursue professionalism and maintain ethical practice. Co-requisite: ECE 202 and ECE 203, no prerequisite.

ECE 202 Administrative Technology for ECE 1 hour
This course will cover the use of computer programs used to track, bill, and record payments for childcare, general accounting and paperwork for submitting claims. Co-requisite: ECE 201 and 203.

ECE 203 Assistive Technology Skills for Early Childhood 1 hour Students will evaluate and demonstrate appropriate use of assistive technologies with young children with learning difficulties. Students are encouraged to use their experiences to contribute to the course format. Co-requisite: ECE 201 and ECE 202.

ECE 204 Parenting 3 hours
This course examines parenting from a socio-cultural and developmental perspective using a systems model. Co-requisite(s)/Prerequisite(s): None.

#### COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

#### **COURSE ADDITION**

JPN 403 Japanese Film in English 3 hours

A survey of Japanese cinema from literary, historical, cultural, and interdisciplinary perspectives. Readings and lectures introduce the director's work and the backgrounds of individual films. Course taught in English. Co-requisite(s)/Prerequisite(s): None.

#### **COURSE DELETION**

FRN 312 Foreign Language Teaching Techniques 3 hours

Rationale: Course is being replaced by FRN 407, in order to update the course and align it more appropriately in our program.
