**SR-07-08-(43) 74 CC**

Recommends approval of the listed **REQUEST FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADDITION, DELETION, OR CHANGE OF AN AREA OF EMPHASIS** from the **COLLEGE OF EDUCATION & HUMAN SERVICES**:

Action Requested: Addition of an area of emphasis, Food Service Management

Rationale: To meet the requirement for the dual degree arrangement for students that possess an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from accredited community and technical colleges, and plan to pursue a B.A. in Family & Consumer Sciences degree program at MU. Currently an agreement has been reached for graduates with an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from MCTC to be admitted into the B.A. in FCS, hence the proposed new addition of area of emphasis within the major.

Curriculum: MCTC 70 hours; MU 65 hours – Gen Ed 10 hours, ENG 6 hours, MGT 6 hours, FCS 30 hours, ISC 4 hours, and Multicultural/International 9 hours, for a total of 132 hours.

Action Requested: Addition of an area of emphasis, Hotel/Lodging

Rationale: To meet the requirement for the dual degree arrangement for students that possess an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from accredited community and technical colleges, and plan to pursue a B.A. in Family & Consumer Sciences degree program at MU. Currently an agreement has been reached for graduates with an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from MCTC to be admitted into the B.A. in FCS, hence the proposed new addition of area of emphasis within the major.

Curriculum: MCTC 67 hours; MU 65 hours – Gen Ed 14hours, ENG 6 hours, MGT 6 hours, FCS 27 hours, MTH 3 hours, and Multicultural/International 9 hours, for a total of 132 hours.

Action Requested: Addition of an area of emphasis, Culinary Arts

Rationale: To meet the requirement for the dual degree arrangement for students that possess an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from accredited community and technical colleges, and plan to pursue a B.A. in Family & Consumer Sciences degree program at MU. Currently an agreement has been reached for graduates with an Associate Degree in Hospitality Management from MCTC to be admitted into the B.A. in FCS, hence the proposed new addition of area of emphasis within the major.

Curriculum: MCTC 74 hours; MU 61 hours – Gen Ed 6 hours, ENG 6 hours, MGT 6 hours, FCS 27 hours, IST 4 hours, MTH 3 hours, and Multicultural/International 9 hours, for a total of 135 hours.


