CURRICULUM COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

SR-05-06-(09) 54-111 CC

Recommends approval of the listed **COURSE ADDITIONS** in the following colleges and/or schools:

- **COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS**

HST 446 The Rise of the Atlantic World, 1400 – 1800 3 hours
This course considers the expansion of western Europe, beginning in the early 1400s to Africa, Latin America, and other parts of the Atlantic world. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None

INT 100 Introduction to International Affairs 3 hours
A survey of the processes and issues surrounding globalization. This course is the introductory course for International Affairs majors. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None.

PSC 412 International Political Economy 3 hours
This course will examine the evolution and structure of the global economic system with emphasis on the development of the Liberal International Economic Order. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None.

PSC 416 Politics of Development 3 hours
A survey of major theories development and modernization and issues confronting developing nations around the world. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None

PSC 417 Homeland Security and Civil Liberties 3 hours
An examination of the policy issues involved in protecting the U.S. homeland from terrorist and other threats, with special attention to the impact such policies have on individual liberties. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None.

PSC 431 Politics of Global Terrorism 3 hours
An examination of terrorism globally, both in its development and its current manifestations, with attention to its attractions, the difficulties of confronting it, and its implications for democratic society. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: None.

- **COLLEGE OF SCIENCE**

IST 428 CAD and Terra Modeling 3 hours
Introduction to CAD 2D and 3D principles set in a land modeling format. Data sets will be used to model 3D contours of land and river beds. Prerequisite: IST 231 or MTH 229.

IST 435 Biomonitoring 4 hours
Biomonitoring is the use of organisms to assess habitat and water quality of a stream. Current aquatic biomonitoring focuses on the utilization of benthic invertebrates and fishes communities. Co-requisite/Prerequisite: BSC 120 or equiv; IST 323 or equiv
