CJ 326 Computer Crime 3 hours Students will identify and define criminal acts committed with computers or directed toward computer systems, electronic search and seizure and electronic evidence. Co-requisite: Prerequisite: None.

CL 236 Murder in the Ancient World 3 hours Taught in English, this is a thematic study of the topic of murder as it appears in the genres of tragedy, oratory and history. Co-requisite: Prerequisite: ENG 101 or YGS 161.

HST 437 Seminar in Public History 3 hours Introduction to the basic theories, ideas, and approaches to the application of historical theory or methods to projects presented to non-student publics; local and economic development applications and projects emphasized. Co-requisite: Prerequisite: None

PSC 442 Politics and Welfare 3 hours A comparative course examining the political institutional methods states use to assist citizens who are poor, primarily women and children. It also addresses behavioral concerns that shape welfare policy. Co-requisite: Prerequisite: None
