Recommends approval of the listed **COURSE ADDITIONS** in the following colleges and/or schools:

- **COLLEGE OF EDUCATION & HUMAN SERVICES**

PLS 452 Construction of OHV Trail Systems 3 hours
A course designed to instruct students in contemporary methods and techniques of constructing OHV trails and related facilities.

- **COLLEGE OF FINE ARTS**

ART 318 Art & Design for Websites (Art/Design for Web) 3 hours
This course will focus on art and design considerations in creating web sites. Current software will be used to create graphics, video and audio for web page and website design. Prerequisite: ART 316.

- **COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS**

CL 465 Ancient Greek Theater Production 3 hours
This course introduces students to ancient Greek plays from a performance/production perspective. The class produces and performs one of these plays during the semester. Prerequisite: 200 or 300 level Classics course or permission.

ENG 202 Writing about Literature 3 hours
Introduction to literary genres, terms and methods required for writing about literature, and basic research skills. Prerequisite: ENG 101.

PRT 101 Elementary Portuguese I 3 hours
Pronunciation, vocabulary, and basic language structures. For students with no foreign language experience.

PRT 102 Elementary Portuguese II 3 hours
Emphasis on oral communication and listening comprehension, some reading and writing. Basic/intermediate language structures. Prerequisite: PRT 101.

PRT 203 Intermediate Portuguese III 3 hours
Emphasis on listening comprehension, conversation, reading and writing. Intermediate language structures. Prerequisite: PRT 102.

PRT 204 Intermediate Portuguese IV 3 hours
Development of practical conversational skills, reading for comprehension, and directed compositions. Prerequisite: PRT 203.

• **COLLEGE OF SCIENCE**

CHM 254 Basic Concepts of Organic Chemistry 1 hour

An intensive review of chemical principles intended to better prepare students for organic chemistry (CHM 355). Prerequisite: C or better in CHM 212.
