ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CURRICULA REVIEW COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

SR-94-95-(106)213(ASCR)

To approve the attached proposal for an International Area of Emphasis in the Division of Finance and Economics, College of Business.

RATIONALE: This Area of Emphasis will be of benefit to our students who want to signal to potential employers that they have focused on global issues in their coursework. The addition of this concentration will also remove a potential problem -- already identified -- during the upcoming official accreditation visit.

During the Fall 1995 Semester we plan to change the title and description of ECN 420, to make them match more closely the actual course content. In addition, we plan to fill a significant gap in our international economics coverage by adding one new course --tentatively entitled "Exchange Rates and International Monetary Relations" (ECN 4XX on attachment).
