SR-89-90-23 (GR)

That a Master's of Science degree in Nursing be created.

BACKGROUND/RATIONALE: The School of Nursing is proposing a Master of Science in Nursing program. The purpose of the Master of Science in Nursing program is to prepare graduates to practice advanced level professional nursing in clinical, administrative, or academic positions. The primary focus of the curriculum is the development of knowledge and skills essential to the advanced practice of nursing and leadership in the delivery of health care. This program has been developed in response to a West Virginia Legislature action in Spring 1989 and monies have already been allocated for the program.
