Recommendation December 13, 1989

SR-89-90-45 (SCW)

To approve the following statement related to the ban on campus sales of tobacco products:

"While we acknowledge that smoking is a health risk, emphasis should be placed on restricting smoking areas on campus rather than on prohibiting the sale of tobacco products themselves."

<u>Discussion/Rationale</u>: The statement was presented to the committee by the Student Health Advisory Committee. While some members felt that we need to start somewhere to create a "smoke-free" environment, other members raised the following objections to the proposed ban: that it appears to be hypocritical; that MU would lose revenue if tobacco sales were halted; that the ban is futile as long as smoking itself is permitted on the campus; and that there is concern for the rights of the individual. Greg Leaming well expressed the committee's attitude: "The action of purchasing tobacco does not harm others; it is the action of <u>use</u> which does so."

SC&W felt that the <u>Physical Facilities Committee</u> should study the feasibility of designating smoking and smoke-free areas on the campus.
