The Graduate Committee recommends the following changes in the catalog statement regarding admission requirements for the Clinical Psychology Masters' Degree Program. (Underlining identifies statements to be changed.)

Current Statement: Requirements for admission include aptitude and subject tests sections of the GRE, three letters of reference, and undergraduate transcripts. Undergraduate coursework must include a course in behavioral statistics and a lab course in psychology; students' transcripts should show thorough grounding in basic psychology courses to ensure unconditional acceptance into the program. A minimal preparation would include at least 15 hours in Psychology.

Recommended Changes:

1. Undergraduate course work must include courses in behavioral statistics, experimental, abnormal, and physiological psychology, and at least two of the following -- learning, social, developmental, personality, or psychometrics.
2. A minimal preparation would include at least 18 hours in Psychology.
