ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND CURRICULA REVIEW COMMITTEE

Recommendation

SR-89-90-106 (ASCR)

That the Criminal Justice Department's request regarding their proposal to institute an undergraduate candidacy be rejected.

RATIONALE: The establishment of a candidacy is not defensible unless it is a function of the academic demands of a program. The Criminal Justice Department's problem is not the quality of the students but the number of students. The retroactive nature of the eligibility criteria, which became effective as of October 31, 1989, does not serve in the best interest of the students. Other alternatives for dealing with over-enrollment and understaffing need to be considered.
