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### FACULTY PERSONNEL COMMITTEE Meeting of 2 December 1988

Motion #2

Background: The Summer School Proposal has an extensive background in its short existence. It began as last academic year's (Spring '88) "Modest Proposal" and came to us this academic year (Fall '88) as a more extensive document. The salient feature of the Modest Proposal was to have all segments of the university (i.e. administrators as well as faculty and staff) share, proportionately, any burden brought about by summer school funding shortfalls. That idea was rejected by the administration. The "New Proposal" (Fall '88) under review at the most recent FPC meeting avoided any mention of administration personnel being subjected to financial exigencies. As a result:

> Dr. Hensley moved that we edit the top of page 4 (under the heading of, ("IV. Summer School Budget Exigency"), to read: "...have led to the financial exigency. If a financial exigency is declared, all segments of the university should share proportionately in the cuts. ["With the declaration of financial exigency,"]..... Cuts will be made subject to the following conditions:"
