I have graded your beauties and marked what I think is their fair position on the back of their photos.

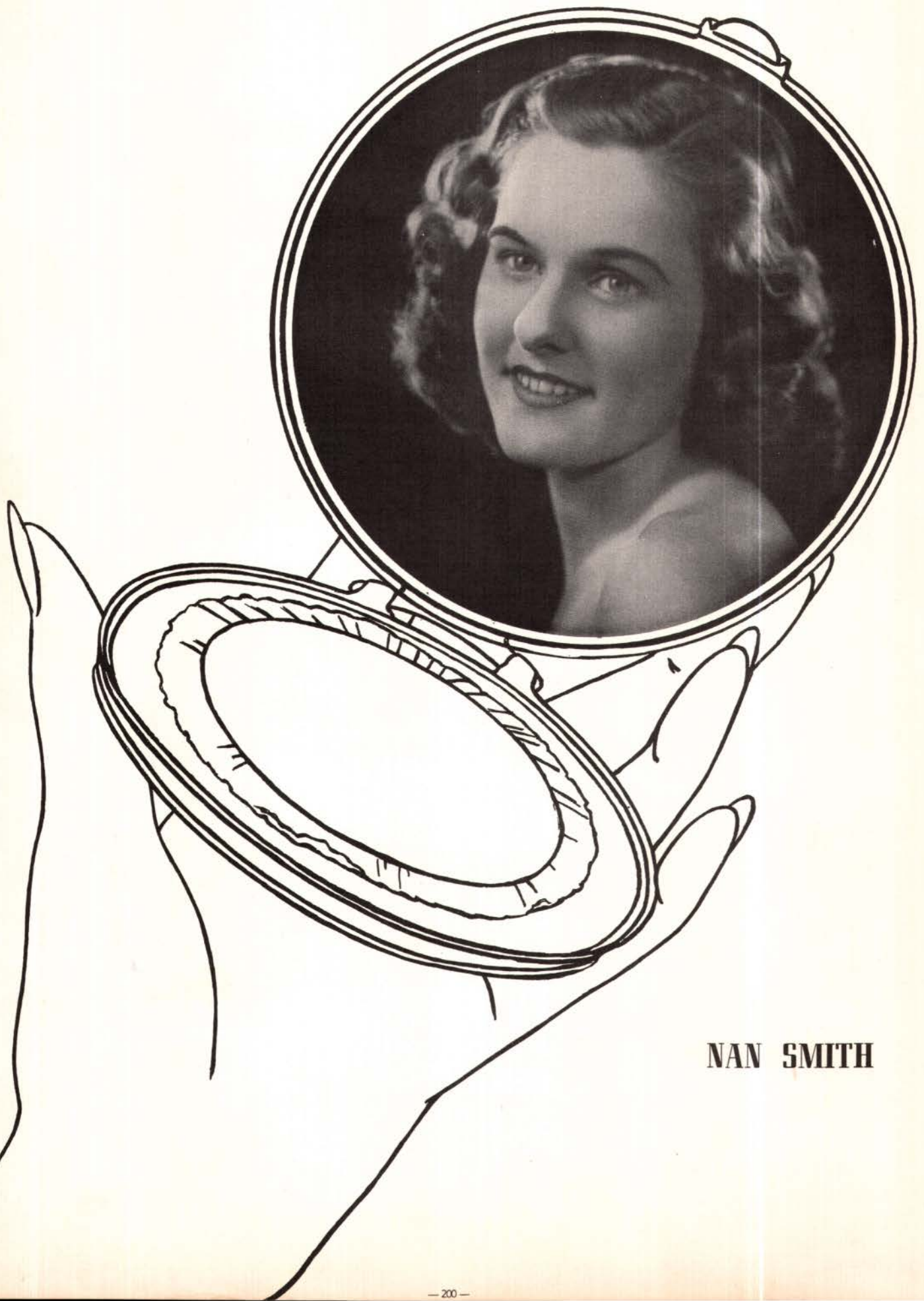
I hope I have done no injustices. Sometimes a girl's coloring makes a lot of difference but I haven't that to consider using photos only.
