

[Marshall Digital Scholar](#) (MDS) is a digital institutional repository (IR) containing the intellectual output of Marshall University's faculty, staff, and students. It brings the university's scholarly output under one electronic umbrella, with the aim to preserve and provide access to that research. It is an excellent vehicle for working papers or copies of published articles and conference papers. Presentations, theses and dissertations, and other works not published elsewhere can also be published in MDS.

Any author publishing work in [Marshall Digital Scholar](#) must either have copyright for the work or the permission of the copyright holder to publish it in MDS. If the author retains copyright for their submission, no further efforts are required, and they may proceed to the submission process, as determined by the administrator of the specific community to which the author is submitting. If the author does not maintain copyright, he/she still may be able to submit material to MDS. Many publishers will allow placement in an institutional repository of articles published in their journals or books as a form of "self-archiving" in pre-print or post-print form. If an author is unable to determine whether they retain the right to post their material in the repository, they can contact the [MDS team](#) for assistance.

Articles may also be available as open access articles from various locations such as, HighWire, Wiley Science Online, etc.. The [Budapest Open Access Initiative](#) defines open access as free availability on the public internet, permitting any users to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or use them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself.
