COLLEGE OF BUSINESS:

COURSE TITLE: Health Care Prods & Services MGT 355 3 hours
COURSE DESCRIPTION: Application of business principles as they apply to the management of health care products and services in today's health care environment.
*Pre-requisite (s): MGT 350, MKT 340

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

COURSE TITLE: Emerging Tech & Libraries ITL 460 3 hours
COURSE DESCRIPTION: Using new and emerging technologies to facilitate and foster online information literacy instruction, support digital resource management, perform digital reference and public services, and assess services and return on investment (ROI).
*Pre-requisite (s): None

COLLEGE OF HEALTH PROFESSIONS:

COURSE TITLE: Intermediate Yoga PEL 290 1 hour
COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is an intermediate yoga class building off of beginning yoga. It will focus on poses, breathing, relaxation, and meditation.
*Pre-requisite (s): PEL 180 or permission

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS:

COURSE TITLE: RTTP: Greece and Rome CL 477 3 hours
COURSE DESCRIPTION: Reacting to the Past: Greece and Rome is a semester long game/simulation where students play historical characters in Athens in 403BC then in Rome just after Julius Caesar's assassination.
*Pre-requisite (s): ENG 101, CMM 103

COURSE TITLE: Food in World History HST 390 3 hours

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course examines the key changes and continuities in human food consumption patterns and practices since the Neolithic period while comparing and contrasting the food-ways of major civilizations and cultures.

*Pre-requisite (s): None

COURSE TITLE: Food Markets and Modernity HST 392 3 hours

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course examines the social and cultural history of various types of urban food markets in Western Europe and the United States from the late eighteenth century to the present.

*Pre-requisite (s): None

COURSE TITLE: Japanese Grammar JPN 330 3 hours

COURSE DESCRIPTION: A review of intermediate level of Japanese grammar equivalent to N3 and N4 JLPT (Japanese Language Proficiency Test). It familiarizes students with test components including vocabulary, reading, grammar, and listening.

*Pre-requisite (s): JPN 204 or permission

COLLEGE OF SCIENCE:

COURSE TITLE: Tectonics GLY 330 3 hours

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Overview of tectonic processes at plate boundaries, orogenic systems, formation of continents and ocean basins, and tectonic analytical methods.

*Pre-requisite (s): GLY 110 or 200, GLY 201, GLY 210L, and GLY 211L
