UNITED NATIONS

The great amount of activity at the UN recently has made it the center of attention and a focal point for criticism. We need not rely on partisan newspaper editorials for information about the UN's activities. We recommend you read Mrs. George Little, observer at the UN for L.V., as she writes in the Sept. 1960 NATIONAL VOTER, about UN in Evolution". She samples the UN agenda for 1960, including Permanent Force, Disarmament, Africa, etc.

In the 1960-61 Pocket Reference on the UN, the assessed budget calls for 20¢ per capita in the U.S. for 1960. Add to this the cost of Special Voluntary Programs such as the Children's Fund, UNITAF, and World Health Organizations, and the total cost of the UN to each U.S. citizen is about 67¢ this year.
