From Your President

WHAT YOU CAN DO FOR YOUR FEDERATION

With a year of purposeful accomplishment behind us, we step now into the final lap. These last months are very meaningful to the future of our Federation as well as in obligation to carefully totaling each member's contribution and dedication to our program. I am referring to our final reporting and the duties of the department and Division Chairmen in making our final record for state and GFWC contests.



The Club president will compile the achievements in her own club, and assume the vitally important leadership role of reporting the work to each division chairman, who in turn carefully prepares her report for the department chairman. In your Directory is listed all department and division chairmen, names and addresses. It is of great interest to the Federation that every Club in West Virginia report their Community Improvement program to Maxine Scarbro. The Pap Smear and Safety reporting cards are available from your State Chairmen.

All reports from West Virginia Projects and Department Chairmen must be made in triplicate. Each Division Chairman will send **directly** to her GFWC Chairman a report of her work, as well as each Department Chairman making a summary of her entire Department and sending it to her GFWC Chairman. Don't forget, Club Presidents, a copy of your report must go to your District President, who will send a summary of her District's accomplishments to me. The Department and Division Chairmen have set a deadline for getting your report to them, and all final reports **must** be in my hands by March 1st since April 1st is the deadline for GFWC reports.

The reports should be compiled now and added activities jotted down as they are completed. I cannot emphasize enough how important it is to your Federation and its members that these reports be carefully prepared and dispatched to meet the time requirements.

It is my sincere hope that our Federation will honor one of our Past Presidents in attending our own South-eastern Council meeting in Pinehurst this month. Virginia Muntzing is President of the Southeastern Conference, and we can show her how proud and grateful we are that she honored West Virginia in giving of her time and effort in the leadership she has given to the state participating in this Council body.

Another request is that we support our Junior Candi-

date Maxine Scarbro in her post as Junior Director — by attending the GFWC Convention this spring in Washington, D. C.

My final thought concerns our survival. First of all it is my belief that we must change our quality of thinking — effective actions in any endeavor requires preparation. We must have facts and faith on which to build any plan. The first step might be to start thinking in global terms which requires different assumptions from Nationalist terms. Today we are world citizens. Small scale thinking upon atomic testing and the United Nations organization will not be effective action, but think that such testing fouls the air breathed by three billion souls and the United Nations, our own organization, is to secure peace among all the peoples of the world. In all this changed thinking we need to know more facts. We need to know more about many many peoples — Chinese, Mohammedan, Russian, Japanese, Indian, Indonesian, African; to paraphrase Kipling and ask: "What can they know of Europe who only Europe know." World History is fascinating and exhilarating, and we must go back in the past of all these people to anticipate what they will do in the future. There, perhaps we shall find a factor in which we can have some faith that both survival and peace will be assured to the human race as we look to the future. Man has always held the belief that life is better than death and love better than hate, and a subconscious sense that he is part of something greater and better than himself.

We also must learn more of what is happening today — particularly inside the so-called Iron Curtain. On September 19th, the President of the United States made a remarkable speech before the United Nations Assembly. For the first time, a national leader declared to the world that the use of nuclear weapons was morally wrong — by Christians,

Need For Psychiatric Library In State

A complete psychiatric reference library is the primary need in the state of West Virginia before we can move forward in the Mental Health program. So such a library will be of value to the staff of the mental hospitals, which is the need; and for purpose of economy this library will be located in

Charleston with a full time librarian. The expense of operating this library including the salary of a full time librarian will be born by the state department of mental health.

All participating institutions in the state will have access to it by letter.

This will give staff members and students the essential reference material that is needed in this field for further research and self improvement.

Furthermore having a central library you will make possible the bringing together and classifying all the books and material at a minimum expense.

As you perhaps know, one of our major problems (health) is the fact that we are losing schools of nursing because they cannot find schools outside the state that will take our students for psychiatric training. This is another reason why we need a comprehensive reference library to make possible the accreditation of a nursing school in the state of West Virginia.

Such a school is being established in the Huntington State Hospital. This is the pilot school which is to serve as a model for the other mental institutions in the state.

This is a golden opportunity for the federated clubs of West Virginia to do an outstanding job in the field of Mental Health which will bring us national recognition.

An allocation within your club's range will be provided as you desire. Each book will be earmarked with a statement identifying its contributor.

In view of the interest of the West Virginia Federation of Women's Clubs have shown in the field of Mental Health it seems reasonable that every one will want to get credit points for this state wide project.

Please let me hear from you as soon as possible. I am working directly with the Psychiatric Nurse Consultant of the West Virginia Department of Mental Health.

Ronceverte Club Serves As Surplus Food Distributors

The Ronceverte Woman's Club now serves as the agency for the distribution of Surplus Food Commodities to the needy people in the Ronceverte area. (See Picture above).

This is a project of the community affairs committee of the club and works hand in hand with the welfare committee.

The agency serves 523 needy families or 1,905 persons. These commodities are given free of charge to D.P.A., and needy families. Each person's name must appear on the list or they do not receive commodities and the families are thoroughly checked before they are placed on the list.

The old post office room, adjoining the Hotel Greenbrier in Ronceverte, serves as an ideal room for the dispensing of the commodities.

On October 25 and 26th, commodities (coming from the Bluefield warehouse) were delivered in Ronceverte. After careful planning and much work by club members, the provisions were given to the needy people on October 30, 31, and November 1st. This must be accurately done, as the woman's club is responsible and must take inventory after each distribution.

The woman's club is also utilizing five A.D.C., (aid to dependent children) workers to help with the unloading and lifting of the heavy boxes.

This is a project which will take the full cooperation of all fifty-four members of the Ronceverte Woman's Club and they should be highly commended for assuming this necessary project.

The Ronceverte Woman's Club is the only woman's club in West Virginia to take on such a project.

Jewish, Mohamedan, Buddhist, Confucian, Marxist ethical standards — and should be stopped; that the best path toward the goal of cessation was through the United Nations. Here is something you can do — and from the grass roots down — three lines will do. To our national leaders and Congressman direct your letters in support of the President's peace drive. This is the only way to be heard. Failure to do this can be interpreted that we believe "force is enough."

Mr. John Wharton concluded one of his recent articles on world affairs by the following passage, "We must have faith in the whole human race. You need not agree with St. Paul that faith can remove mountains, you must only believe it can move the hearts of men."

"It seems to me . . . that Doctor Valkonen's pessimism concerning man's mechanical defenses and his optimistic faith in man himself have been justified by events. The Mannerheim and Maginot lines have gone. But the individual human spirit still lives and resists in the tortured streets of London."

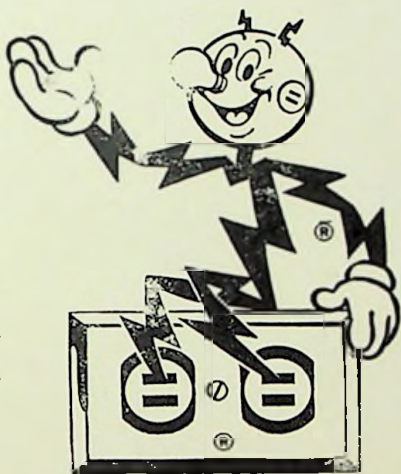

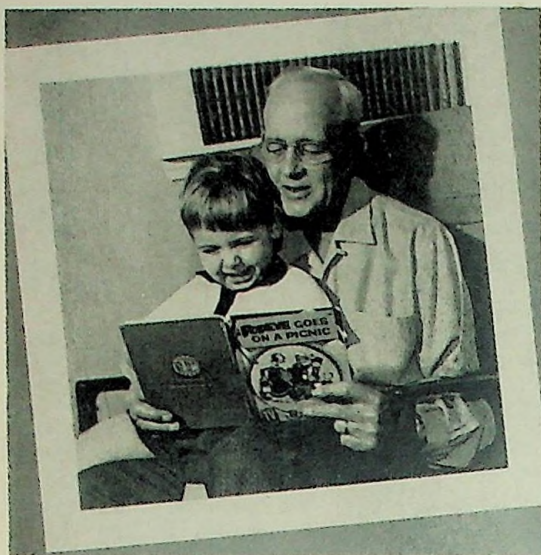
