This Indenture, Made this 14th day of November, in the year of Christ, 1825 between Elizabeth Durting, John Merritt and Sally, his wife, George Merritt, William Strupe, And Margarite his wife, Joseph Wentz and Polly, his wife, Jacob Merritt and Barnara, his wife, Melchor Merritt and Thomas Merritt, of the forst part, and John Dundas and Ann, his wife, of the second part Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar, to them in hand paid, by the party of the second part, for and in consideration of corresponding deeds of partition of the Estate of William Merritt, and the said Ann Dundas, being one of the heirs of the said William Merritt, dec'd, the said Ann Dundas being one of the heirs of of the said William Merritt, dec'd, the said parties of the first part have granted, bargained, sold and given , and by these presents do give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said parties of the first part a certain tract or parcel of land , situate, lying and being in the County of Cabell and the Town of Barboursville, which is bounded as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a stake on Joseph Wentz's line 20 poles from the said Town of Barboursville, , and also a corner of George Merritt's tract, and running thence S. 77-1/2 E ninety poles to a stake in the military line, thence S. 73, W. 30 poles to a black oak; thence S. 2 degrees E. 156 poles to a black oak; thence 72 degrees W 67 poles to a sugar tree and white oak, corner to George Merritt's land and thence N. 2 degrees, W. 164 poles to the Beginning, containing seventy-seven acres of land, be the same more or less, together with all and singular, the appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold the said seventy-seven ~~acres~~ acres of land unto him, the said John Dundas and Ann, his wife,

their heirs and assigns forever. and the said parties of the first part, for themselves and their heirs, do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said parties of the second part and their heirs that they, the said parties of the first part will warrant and defend the title to said land, free from the claim, or claims of themselves and their heirs, and , and free from the claims of all other persons or persons, whatsoever.

This Indenture, Made and entered into the twelveth day of November, in the year of Christ One Thousand, Eight Hundred and Twenty-five, between Elizabeth Durting, John Merritt and Sally, his wife, William Strupe and Margeret, his wife, Joseph Wentz and Polly, his wife, John Dundas and Ann, his wife, George Merritt and Melchor Merritt and Thomas Merritt, parties of the first part & Jacob Merritt, of the second part. Witnesseth That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to them in hand paid, and for and in consideration of corresponding deeds conveying to them said Jacob Merritt's right to the lands inherited as, and of the heirs of William Merritt, dec'd as by partition mutually agreed to, they have given, granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said Jacob Merritt, his heirs and assigns forever, a certain tract, or parcel of land situated in the County of Cabell and adjoining the lot assigned to Melchor Merritt, and bounded as follows to-wit: Beginning at a white oak beech and dogwood, corner to Melchor Merritt, S. 70 degrees, E. 100 poles to an elm and black oak, then S. 20 degrees W. 100 poles, crossing Mud river to an ash; thence S. 88, W. 105 poles to two white oaks, a corner of Melchor Merritt & with his line N. 20 E. 120 poles to the Beginning, containing Seventy-seven acres, with all and singular, its appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, To have and to hold the above granted piece, or parcel of land unto the said Jacob Merritt, his heirs or assigns forever. To the only use and behoof of him, the said Jacob Merritt, his heirs and assigns forever And the said Elizabeth Durting, John Merritt & Sally, his wife, William Strupe and Margeret, his wife, Joseph Wintz and Polly, his wife.
