The Hugh Petit Family.

Hughriah (Hugh) Petit is said to have been born, about 1812. His parents were Thomas and "Jain" Petit, and his grand-
parents were Obediah and ——— Petit,
all of Fauquier County, Va. They were
of French descent.

Hugh Petit was married, in
Fauquier County, to Frances Carter,
on Decr 21, 1838. He was married
the second time, ^{July 13, 1881} ~~Nov. 6, 1862~~, to
^{Nancy V. Stewart} ~~Mary Ann Wright~~, single, aged 23.
He gave his age as 60, and
stated that he was born, in
Fairfax County, Virginia (see the
^{marriage} record, at Catlettsburg, ^{File 7-a, - 84-346})
His children were all by Frances
Carter, his first wife.
