## CONTENT AND SCOPE OF THE COLLECTION

A major portion of the Mary Constance Enslow papers consists of her genealogical notes and notebooks. There are copious notes on her family genealogy, both maternal and paternal, as well as notes compiled for other families. Included in this part of the collection are examples of her work as a designer of coats of arms and bookplates, and as a commercial artist.

Books and printed material are contained in the collection; much of the printed material is made up of news clippings about a variety of subjects. There is an extensive clipping file concerning the royal family of England.

Among her personal papers are family letters and news clippings, as well as scrapbooks and diaries.

Correspondence is included in the papers, most of it concerning genealogical matters. Photographs and snapshots of family, friends, and subjects of personal interest are also a part of the collection.

## MARY CONSTANCE ENSLOW, 1892-1962

Mary Constance Enslow was born in Huntington, West Virginia, on February 18, 1892. After graduation from Huntington High School in 1909, she attended Marshall College and was employed as a substitute teacher in Huntington area schools. In 1912 she went to Chicago to enroll at the Chicago Academy of Fine Arts. Completing her studies in 1914, she began her career as a commercial artist, maintaining her own studio in the Fine Arts Building. As an artist, Miss Enslow did extensive work as an illustrator and a designer of bookplates and coats of arms, as well as much work in the field of advertising. She also served as an art instructor at the Chicago Academy of Fine Arts and for the Chicago Board of Education Adult Education Program.

A published poet, Miss Enslow also served as editor of "Motif", the magazine of the Three Arts Club in Chicago. She was also a ghost writer of book reviews, newspaper columns, and job analysis.

She died in Chicago on June 18, 1962.

One of them received some notoriety as the reputed father of Abraham Lincoln, but William E. Barton has disproved this..."

- March 8, 1945 - Salt Lake City, Utah: Letter from Benjamin L. Bowring of the Genealogical Society of Utah requesting a copy of Miss Enslow's material on the Enslow family for a patron.

- August 8, 1929 - Richmond, Va.: Letter discussing family genealogy and records. He expresses hope of going back to Wheelersburg, Ohio, and on to Illinois with his cousin Florence Enslow and comments on the theft of a portfolio containing Bliss family history.

April 24, 1951 - Baldwin, Maryland: This letter discusses family ancestry and the search that Mr. Enslow made in Maryland and Pennsylvania records for family data.

April 20, 1920 - Virginia, Ill.: Letter comparing family notes. He tells of an uncle who died during the Civil War, of whom Miss Enslow had no record, and of the impending visit of a cousin from California. He discusses his children and invites Miss Enslow to come for a visit.
