


"REMEMBER THE LADIES" EVENT

ADVOCACY

Health Care -- The issue that is at the top of many Americans' list is Health Care. For many years the LWVUS has supported a basic level of health care for all Americans. Thus we oppose Congress' efforts to weaken the Affordable Care Act.

US Election Integrity Commission (Voters Suppression Agenda) - The League opposes efforts of the Commission to investigate voter fraud if it threatens voters ability to exercise their right to vote. The LWVUS joined in a letter sent to all 50 Secretaries of State condemning and opposing the data request by President Trump's advisory commission. The League continues to stand with the election officials who have rejected the request for sensitive information and urges those that have not responded to carefully consider future responses to the commission.

Jonathan Rosenbaum, president of the WV League, also sent a letter to WV's Secretary of State.

US Election Assistance Commission - The League joined in a letter in support of an amendment to The financial services and general government appropriations bill that would restore funding for the Election Assistance Commission (EAC). The amendment, offered by Representative Quigley, was not adopted, but provisions increasing the level of funding and removing language that terminated the agency were removed from the legislation through another mechanism. The League will continue to watch these funding levels as the appropriations process moves forward.

A Budget that Meets Basic Human Needs

The League joined more than 1,500 groups in a letter that calls on Congress to pass a budget that adequately meets the needs of all people and communities. The letter encourages investments in public education, affordable housing, health and nutrition, public transit, roads and bridges, clean air, clean water, clean energy, child care, and other means of making investments in communities that also create good jobs.

RIGHT TO VOTE READERS THEATER

The Huntington League offers our presentation of the Right to Vote Readers Theater to organizations that would like to understand the struggles throughout our nation's history of efforts to achieve the right to vote. Unfortunately, voting suppression is still a part of our nation's scene. We need to be vigilant in West Virginia to protect our right to vote when some legislators submit bills to weaken that protection.
