1. Financial statistics of the institute.

2. Severence pay for Betsy Mort.

4. Motion to disolve.

Nan embry moved that the fund be for a neuro-psychiatric event, Virginia Hoeing seconded the motion and motion carried.

The final event was the motion that the Owen Clinic Institute Inc. be disolved. Dr. Stemmermann suggested that the Institute be disolved on 3.1.82 or as soon thereafter as feasable. Shirdey Smalley seconded the motion and motion Carried. Attached is the formal motion propared for disolution by attorney William Matthews.

There being no further business except that the Board felt a picnic in the summer for old times sake was expected the Board members moved that the final meeting be afjourned and unaminously seconded and accepted.
