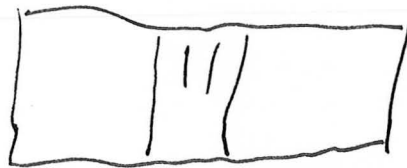

I stopped here. It is of logs weatherboarded. I went up stairs. The room toward Wayne had a large 2x5 paneled=10 window in upper end. It was about 16 X 18 ft X 7 ft. high. Had one window on each side. Ample light. Floor of 6 in lumber probably made by hand. Hand made door. Stairway in middle into small room like center



1 window in each side.

A fine hand carved wood mantel probably for down stairs. 12 pane windows.

Only one small window in lower end. & room only 2 logs high.

A Buckingham Genealogy

"The Ancestors of Ebenezer
Buckingham, who was born
in 1748, and of his de-
scendants".

By James Buckingham
of Zanesville, Ohio. One of
his grandsons assisted by
Miss Mary J. Tilton.

The Buckingham Family

"The name B., was derived from Buceu or Becan, or Bechan - beech trees, and ham, a village, from the number and size of the beech trees. In his Anglo-Saxon Dictionary, Bosworth spells the name Buceingham, and also Buccheheim.

Another authority derives the name from Buceu, from the great number of deer, in the forest there.

Many of the family in the U. S. have been distinguished scholars (11 from Yale) & other colleges, & distinguished in the learned professions.

Rev. Thomas Buckingham claimed Welsh extraction

Old English name probably from the County of Buckingham. Note - the crest on the family coat of arms is a deer or stag's head.

Thos. Buckingham is said
to have been the ancestor of
all the American Buckinghams.

His company sailed from
London in two ships, arrived
at Boston June 26, 1637, went
to what is now New Haven,
Conn. Arrived there April 1638.
Later he removed to Milford
1639. Church records of
New Haven, from Records
at Milford name Thos. B. as
one of 7 members (at New Haven
dating from Aug. 22, 1639
He d. at Boston, 1657. where
he went to secure a church pastor.
His will is found at New
Haven. He m. 1 Hannah
m. 2 Ann, who made a
will 1686. Hannah d. at
Milford June 28, 1646 - 5 children.

The above book on
the Buckinghams is very
finely gotten up but does
not seem to connect with
the family I am searching
for.
