There will be a China Study Unit Meeting at the Enslow Park Presbyterian Church, Wed., Sept. 20 from 9:30 to 11:30. Babysitters are provided.

This meeting will conclude our study of "The China Puzzle". We now have plenty of copies of this booklet which will be available at the meeting.

As soon as school settles down THE CHINA PUZZLE books, published by the National League Office will be distributed to the social studies teachers in the local high schools and to the public libraries. Our China study group thought this was too informative to keep to ourselves so we are distributing about 20 for the public.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION CONSENSUS

These are the questions from the State Board to be used in arriving at a position on the Vocational Education Item:

1. Does your League support an expanded vocation and technical education system for persons of all ages for West Virginia?
2. Does your League support adequate state financing for vocational and technical education programs?
3. Does your League favor planning at the state level to cover teacher training programs, curriculum and facilities and to meet projected labor market trends?
4. Does your League favor the establishment and expansion of teacher training programs for vocational and technical education in state supported schools of higher education?

There are meetings on Vocational Education scheduled in Oct. and Nov. If you have thought about these questions a bit before the meetings you will be better prepared to understand the material and better able to reach consensus.
