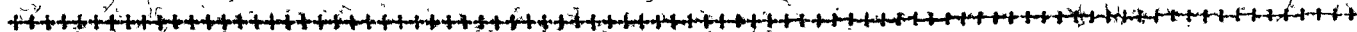
JAMES McCLELLAN, Huntington Park Board, to be speaker

BY LAWS CHANGE

We will vote on the following By-Laws change at the Annual Meeting:

2. "If any member of the League becomes aware of prospective members who are financially unable to join and would contribute works, the President may find dues assistance from sources outside the treasury."

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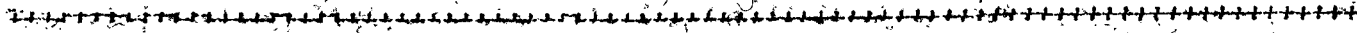

PROPOSED PROGRAM 1980

This is last year's program, supported by the Board:

Examination of local agency compliance with federal regulations, in the areas of:-

EDUCATION (considering such areas as)

- Title I (federal aid to schools with certain percentage of low income students)
- Title VI (handicapped)
- Title IX (sex discrimination)
- Public Law 94-142 (mainstreaming)

COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAMS (considering such areas as)

- What are the federal regulations which pertain to situations such as conflict between two local agencies?
- Are there regulations requiring community participation and, if so, are agencies meeting requirements?

HOUSING (considering such areas as)

- Discrimination
- Redlining mortgages
- Are local citizens utilizing HUD low-income programs? If not, why?

WELFARE (considering such areas as)

- Are eligible people utilizing available programs?
- What efforts are made to inform people of eligibility requirements?
- If people are informed, and not utilizing programs, why not?

Emphasis will be monitoring to answer questions such as:

1. How does compliance impact on service delivery in the agency?
2. How much employee time is spent in compliance versus direct service?
3. What is the intent of the regulations for the best interest of the recipient of service?
4. Do regulations call for citizens input and how is this implemented?
5. What difficulties do the agencies have in coming into compliance with the regulations? Does the agency use these difficulties to explain problems in service?
6. In what ways have these regulations benefited the designated recipients?

After examination of regulations, appropriate action, after consensus, will be taken.

T H E D R A F T ?

Ruth J. Hinerfeld, President LWVUS, recently sent a memorandum to all State and Local Presidents which addresses the question, "what is the League's position on the Draft, registering for the Draft, and on drafting women?" Here's her answer:

The LWV has no position on a mandatory registration system or the draft per se because our membership has never studied these particular issues. We do have, however, a very strong and to us incontrovertible belief that women and men should be treated equally under the law. Thus, we could not and would not oppose drafting or registering women.
