Bryan Creek.

The Bryan name should be so spelled.

It is 3-4 miles from the mouth of Bryan Cr to the mouth of Little Guyan Creek.

My great uncles and aunts were: ~ Nimrod Sr., Lawrence ("Larry"), Gabriel, etc.,

Nimrod Sr. lived on Bryan Cr., about a mile above the mouth of the creek.

Lawrence lived just above ~~them~~ Nimrod Sr. The creek is about 6 miles long.

Gabriel lived

Lawrence Chapel, Southern Methodist, was nearest church, named from Lawrence Bryan. Established more than 50 years ago.

The "Bryan School", an old log was on the ridge, around from the church about $\frac{1}{4}$ mi. in direction of Glenwood. I have seen it, ~~and~~ but it was no longer used.

Nimrod's wife lives with a Mrs. Perry on 30th bet 3rd & 4th Ave. with a dau. - upper side. Mrs. Bryan was Etta Rose, dau. of James Rose who lived where Bob Cooneyton now lives, near Barber School near the head of Bryan Cr. on Barber Ridge
