LETTER FROM THE LOCAL PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

Thank you so very much for sending me to the National Convention in Chicago. Having the opportunity to see the League as a whole, in action, convinces the individual delegate of the important role this organization is playing in modern society.

There were several interesting decisions that the convention made after introducing the new program items, caucusing, and arguing on the floor for several days. 1. In the Development of Human Resources Item, "Support of equality of opportunity for education and employment", was extended to cover "housing", too. This passed by an overwhelming majority principally for two reasons. Many state and local Leagues already have a consensus of support for open housing and open housing is now Federal Law. Mrs. Benson, the new national president, stated that if a local League has no consensus, on open housing, it should study it before it can take action. Therefore the Huntington League is planning units for early June. (see calendar) 2. A new item was voted by the convention to be a part of the National Program, although it was not a part of the proposed program before convention. This new study will be "The Electoral College." On the local board, Mrs. Lon Hill will include this in her portfolio.

League members can be assured that the total National League is not controlled by the National Board but is indeed a grass roots organization.


#### CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION
