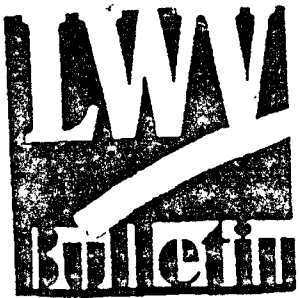

ANNUAL MEETING

The League's Annual Meeting on March 9 includes a business session and lunch. The location is the historical Ramsdell House at 1108 B St., Ceredo. The Civil War house built in 1858 was the first brick house in Ceredo and is located on an Indian mound. It was owned by Captain Z.D. Ramsdell, of the 5th Virginia Volunteer Regiment, who fought in the raid on Guyandotte. Capt. Ramsdell was appointed to the Legislature by Ulysses S. Grant, and worked for free schools. This is an opportunity to inspect one of the most historic landmarks in our area.

The featured speaker is Becky Cain of St. Albans, who is currently serving her second term on the League's National Board. Becky has served on National Program Planning, and currently is serving on Finance and Advocacy Committees. According to Susan Lederman, LWVUS President, Becky did a "...super job on Nat'l. Program Planning, and has been a very effective link between the national board and state and local leagues". Using a term made popular by former NJ Gov. Kean, Lederman described Becky Cain and the League of Women Voters as "perfect together". We look forward to having Becky give us an insight into League operations at the national board level.

Please review the enclosed agenda which shows our proposed budget, board of directors, and local program for the coming year, and bring it with you to the meeting. The business session begins at 10 a.m.

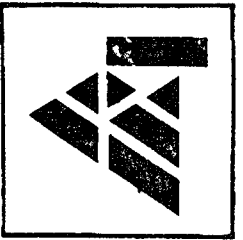
