Hanging of allen Havison He was hanged Sept. 2, 1892, I went to Corbett and Sullivaris fight, in new Orleans, the night he was hung, I put four cells in Cabell Co. jail, where the Hunting Ion Dry Goods Furniture Store on 9th St. allen Havrison gave me his pictures. He was selling his judwies for 10 d each, my wife went to see the hanging It was on the bank of Jour Pole, in Reter Park Bet. 9th & 10th Sto - probably just above 9th St. I never talked to him about the case I never heard the brial, I was in new Orleans, I was pulling 150 cell blocks in The Louriana Penilenliary, at Balon Rouge

Frank adams, father of Bellie adams, and Mrs. adams, wilnesses to the hanging, and said that Harrison deserbed it, in view of the way he had treated their daughter.
