Brown's "First Republic", p 254 (See also p. 313), says under der date prior to June 17, 1617: "It seems certain, however, that he (Argall) located definitely the then bounds of the four great "Incorporations and Parishes of James City, Charles Citty, the citty of Henricus and Miccowtan'" afterwards Elizabeth City County).

And Lieutent'ts to be appointed the same as in England, and in a more especial manner to take care of the warr against Indians.

And as in England, Sheriffs shall be elected to have the same power as there, and sergeants and bailiffs where need be.

Commissioners, instead of five pound causes may be determined ten pound causes, and one of the council to have notice to attend and assist in each scower of shire."

Accawmack was formed in 1634 (H.1, P.224), but the name was changed to Northampton in 1642 /3 (H. 1, p. 249).

The Accommack records begin/April 21, 1663. The exact date of the formation of the County seems to be unavailable, but we know that the Act of March, 1661/2 says that (H II P. 122 @ @ "the use

of the mony raised this years out of the two shillings per hogshead in Northampton County (the name given to the whole of the Eastern shore in 1642/3 (H 1, P. 249) @ @", while the Act of September, 1663--in referring to this Act of 1661/2, says (H. 2, p. 186) " @ @ prohibits the importation of any salt in the counties of Northampton and Accowmack, @ @ @ @ for the said counties, @ @ @", specifying and twice referring to both counties, which must have been in existence at that time.

Also, we are indebted to the Hon. John D. Grant, Jr. Clerk of Accomack, for the following caption of the first Court of that County, as it appears in the earliest volume of records, (D. & W. 1663-1666):

"At a Court held in Accomack County ye 21st April by His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for ye said County in ye fifteenth year of the rRaigne of our Sovereign Lord Charles ye Second by ye Grace of God of Geeat Britain, France and Ireland --King, defender of ye faith, and in ye year of our Lord God 1663. Present Anto, Hodgkins, Captain George Parker, Mr. Rev. Brown, Mr. West, Mr. John Wise." (See also Green's "Genesis of Counties in Slaughter's "Brief Sketch of William Green, LL D." p. 101; and Wise's "Early Mistory of the Eastern Shore of Virginia", p. 173).

We are indebted to Doctor Lyon G. Tyler, of Williamsburg, Va., for the following data concerning the early history of Northumberland County:

"Northumberland was the iIndian name given to the Indian District Chickacoan in February, 1645 (H. 1 p. 294). It was doubtless then created a County by the Governor and Council. In October, 1648. this action was formally confirmed by the General Assembly (H. 1, p. 352): See also account of Northumberland in "William and Mary Quarterly", XXIII p. 182)" See also "Virginia Magazine of History and Biography", XXIII pp. 249, 250.

Morthumberland and Westmoreland were united for "civill and military purposes, by an Act of March, 1661/2 (H. II P.151).

From Robinson's Virginia Counties. Pages 74 and 75.

"PROVIDED always, That the said new counties (Augusta and Frederick) - - - - shall remain part of the county of Orange - - - until it shall be made appear to the Governor and Council, for the time being, that there is a sufficient number of inhabitants for appointing Justices-of-the Peace, and other officers, and erecting Courtstherein, for the due administration of Justice". (H. v.p. 79). But Augusta was not fully organized until the 30th October, 1745". (Waddell's "Annals of Augusta County, Virginia, 1902, page 52: "Virginia Magazine of History and Biography", 2, p. 426).

West Augusta District (17??-1776), says Waddell's "Annals of Augusta County, Virginia, 1902, p.252 appwars to have been e-vilved, rather than created by law. Its existence was first recognized by the Legislature during the session which began October 7, 1776, when an Act was passed (H.9 p.262) "for ascertaining the boundary line between the county of Augusta and the District of West Augusta (and for dividing the said district into three distinct counties)".

An examination of the "Journals of the House of Eurgesses" (Virginia State Library, 1905-1915), all of which have appeared since Waddell's "Annalls" was published, does not throw any additional light upon the subject: but the 1828 reprint of the "Journal of the House of Delegates for 1776", p. 4--in support of the petition of the inhabitants of the western parts of Fincastle County says " - - - - that they consider themselves, and the said lands to be within the State of Virginia, whose Legislature they acknowledge, and to which state they conceive that they justly belong; that, havijg assembled together after due notice

they had elected two members to represent them in this House and hoping that they may be received as their delegates; that they are ready and willing, to the utmost of their abilities, to assist in the support of the present laudable cause, by contributing their quota of men and miney; and that, in order to preserve good order, they had, as was done in West Augusta, elected a Committee of 21 members. - - - - - ".

Obviously, the result of the exigencies of frontier life, but without legislative or legal status, the District of West Augusta was, never-the-less, represented in the Convention of March, 1775 (Peyton's "Augusta County, Virginia", pp. 173, 176, 206 the "Journal" of which (1816 reprint) says, p.4 "A letter from the inhabitants of that part of Augusta County which lies to the westward of the Alleghany Mountains, desiring that John Nevill and John Harvie, Esqrs. may be admitted into this Convention as their delegates, being read; upon a motion, RESOLVED, That the said John Nevill and John Harvie be admitted as delegates for the County of Augusta", even though the same "Journal" p. 3 shows among the delegates listed, "Thomas Lewis, Samuel McDowell, and John Harive, Esqrs, for Augusta", and Lewis's "Report of the Department of Archives and History of the State of West Virginia", 1908, p. 153, shows that Nevill and Harvie were delegates from the "District of West Augusta; and, also (p.154) that John Harvie and George Rootes were the delegates from the same District in the Convention of July, 1775, while the "Journal of the Convention of May, 1776" (1816 re-print), p. 3 contains this in the list of delegates: "West Augusta. John Harvie and Charles Simms, Esquires".

There is every reason to believe that the District of West Augusta was represented in the House of Delegates of October, 1776,

which session passed the Att "for ascertaining the boundary, &c. as this bill was "committed to Mr. Treasurer, Mr. Simms, and the members for Augusta, Frederick, Dunmore, Hampshire, Botetourt and Fincastle, as can be seen by referring to pp. 31, 33 of the 1828 re-print of this "Journal", Mr. Simms being the last delegate from the District of West Augusta whose name we have.

On the other hand, West Augusta does not seem to have been represented in the Convention of August, 1774, although after its abolition by the formation of Monongalia, Ohio, and Yohogania in 1776 (H. Ix p.262) it appears to have been represented in the Virginia Assemblies of May, 1779 and October 1779, by David Rogers, as Senator from the District of West Augusta" (see Lewis above, pp. 103-4,--though a careful analysis will show that this "Fistrict of West Augusta" was evidently the Senatorial District composed of Monongalianic Phio, and Yohogania Counties, simply retaining its old and popular designation, for at the session of May, 1780, we find that the "District of West Augusta" has disapleared, while the Senatorial District of "Lonongalia, Yohogania, and Ohio" appears for the first time,--such a district not appearing at the same time as the "District of West Augusta", although there were delegates from these individual counties.
