Call for Applications - SAFD Business Operations Manager Position for 2008

The Society of American Fight Directors office of the Secretary and Treasurer are soliciting applications for a Business Operations Manager position. This is a paid position responsible for data entry of Skills Proficiency Tests (SPTs), new memberships and membership renewals, as well as helping the Treasurer to manage our accounts, pay our online bills, prepare tax forms and generally maintain the fiscal health of the organization.

Weekly/Bi-weekly responsibilities for this position may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- · Managing Accounts:
 - o Receivable: Deposit checks (generate deposit slips, stamp checks, copy membership and SPT checks for the files) and manage online payments (Linkpoint / CSI-First Data, reconcile CSI-First Data statements with Nevada State Bank statements)
- o Payable: Electronically pay Visa bill, confirm payment of automatic pay accounts, and reconcile Visa credit card bill
- Receipt and Return of Paperwork: Confirm with the Secretary when any paperwork is received; process paperwork within in a timely manner; forward all processed paperwork to the Secretary, including notes about anything out of the ordinary (requests for back copies of the Fight Master, SPT forms submitted without payment, requests for information, etc.)

Data Entry & Filing:

- o Mail: Receive and sort all SAFD mail from the Las Vegas address
- o FM Postcards: Sent to secretary if no test has been received within 30 days for immediate follow-up
- o Membership: Coordinating forms and check copies; entry of all mailed dues payments and new memberships into the database; entry of change of address forms; email payment confirmations to members (using Membership@safd.org, and the Secretary's approved text); distribution of membership cards
- o SPT: Coordinating forms and check copies; and the entry of all SPT information, including test results and payment information
- Update Secretary and Treasurer: Maintain communication with both officers in a timely manner regarding issues, problems and concerns as they arise.

Additional Seasonal Responsibilities:

• Tax Preparation: Prepare and Distribute 1099's no later than January 30 of each year and collect documents for tax preparation in time for May 15 filing

Qualified applicants should meet the following requirements:

- Familiarity with Microsoft Access and Excel
- Extremely efficient data entry abilities and communication skills
- Reliable internet access

This is a paid position, offering \$15 per hour with flexible hours ranging from four to five per week depending on the workload. January and July are the busiest times of the year for us, with many adjudications occurring in December, May and June. The position will be effective as of March 1, 2008 and conclude on February 28, 2009. This is a yearly recurring position.

Certified Teacher Angela Bonacasa ...In the Footlight

Angela Bonacasa has worked across the country as both a stage combat teacher and fight director. A recent transplant from Chicago to Maine, Angela was on staff at Roosevelt University's Chicago College of Performing Arts, the Actors Gymnasium, and taught private classes throughout the city. Additional teaching credits include stints in New York, Seattle, Florida, Texas, Indiana, and North Carolina where she is a regular quest artist at the North Carolina School of the Arts. She also serves as coordinator for NCSA's Summer Stage Combat program. Associate Editor Marcus D. Gregio talked to Ms. Bonacasa for The Cutting Edge.

MDG: How did you first hear about, and get involved with, the Society of American Fight Directors?

AB: I had just graduated from AMDA [American Musical and Dramatic Academy] and my roommate had signed up for a stage combat class. I thought it sounded really cool so I signed up for it with her. It turned out to be an Unarmed class taught by FM [then CT] Mike Chin. From the minute I started that class, I thought it was the coolest thing I had ever seen. I didn't know what the Society was when I signed up, but I learned about it during the rest of Mike's class and the following (equally cool) Rapier and Dagger class taught by FM J. David Brimmer.

MDG: Why did you become a member?

AB: I was so impressed and over-

whelmed with the talent of my incredible teachers, as well as the professional respect and camaraderie that I saw between them, that I had to learn more about the organization.

MDG: How has involvement in the SAFD benefited your career?

AB: I have changed and grown so much as a person because of my involvement with the SAFD that I can't imagine my life without it. Stage combat training aside (and it has been incredible), I have learned so much about myself, who I am, what is important to me, and how I want to live my life in large part because of my involvement in the SAFD. I have formed lifelong friendships, experienced love and loss, and basically grown up in this organization. The SAFD has become another member of my family.

MDG: What is your favorite weapon and why?

AB: Single Sword! As cheesy as it sounds, once I pick one up and start to play, it is hard to put it down. It combines the elements of grace, power, speed, and lightness of touch. To make a rocking Single Sword fight, you have to really be on top of your game; you can't get the speed without the lightness and you can't get the grace without the power.

MDG: When working on a scene, what elements do you consider paramount in a partner?

AB: First, a willingness to play and explore choices, regardless of how silly

they sound—to take your partner's suggestions and, at least, be willing to genuinely listen to them. You never know what is going to trigger that brilliant moment. It can only happen if you are truly interested in your partner's opinion. Second, [one must have] a willingness to take responsibility. Nothing can kill a good working relationship between combatants faster than a partner who is always right. Admit when you've made a mistake.

MDG: Using what you have learned so far on your journey, what advice would you give to someone just becoming interested in the SAFD?

AB: You will meet a lot of different kinds of people in this organization—you can learn from all of them. Work hard and keep pushing yourself to be the best combatant and person you can. Be honest with yourself and with others. Finally, we all have to make our way in this world, but the SAFD only continues to thrive because people who love it continue to give of their time and effort to make it work. Even if it is a small contribution, give of your time and energy to help the organization keep going.

MDG: What is in your pockets right now?

AB: There are no pockets in the clothes that I am wearing right now. In the pockets in the last pair of jeans I wore, though, I am sure I'll find some dirt and brush from working outside—and maybe even a pair of ear plugs that I wore when working the wood splitter.

You will meet a lot of different kinds of people in this organization—you can learn from all of them. Work hard and keep pushing yourself to be the best combatant and person you can.

An NSCW West Testimonial By AC Stephen James Anderson

It has been almost two months since the closing moments of the 2007 National Stage Combat Workshop, yet I still find myself reminiscing about my time and experiences in Las Vegas. From the moment the landing gear met the tarmac at McCarran International to the second my feet met terra firma back in Illinois, the opportunities to grow as a fighter, teacher, and director were plentiful, pleasurable, and profound.

As I made my way to UNLV, I was surprised by the temperate climate: though exceedingly hot, I sweat very little. Of course, our Fight Masters would be creating plenty of opportunities for me to sweat soon enough. I arrived at the residence hall, my home for the next three weeks, and was astounded by the comfortable accommodations. After stowing my gear, it was time to explore the four-and-a-half miles of architecture. spectacle, play and debauchery that is the Vegas Strip, which even at 10:00 a.m. on a Sunday was packed with gamblers, partiers and vacationers of all kinds.




The next day the workshop began in earnest. When I arrived bright and early at the Judy Bailey Theater I was immediately struck by the totality of expertise brought together in one space. Up on the stage loomed (in his pirate like way) SAFD President, FM Chuck Coyl and with him was former President, FM Drew Fracher, who radiated an infectious energy as he welcomed each of us. Meanwhile, FM Geoff Alm, a more recent addition to the College of Fight Masters and a man from whom I would come to learn so much, meandered about welcoming all he came in contact with, FM and NSCW West organizer Michael Chin lived up to his nononsense reputation as he prepared us for the enormity of this event. If the FM's were the heart of the NSCW, then the Certified Teachers provided the soul. CT/FD Ian Rose, CT Ray Rodriguez and CT/FD Scot Mann were easy for me to admire. Impressively, there were seven teachers to twenty-seven students. That's less than four students per teacher: a good ratio by anyone's calculations! All of the teachers, FM's and CT's alike, exhibited patience, commitment, and persistence as they generously shared their expertise with us.



Within an hour of arriving at the theater. I was taking up arms with my fellow participants, the sound of ringing steal filled the air, and in just three short hours I already knew everyone by face, and name. The intensive, immersive and collective environment allowed a bond of mutual respect and admiration to form more quickly than I thought possible. What lingers in the pit of my gut about being engrossed in this type of environment is how I came to know, adore, and admire so many people, so guickly. I could feel the energy given off as they encouraged and pushed me to do my best, to learn, and to grow.

Each day was packed to the brim with combat from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Although we concentrated on three weapons for the purposes of preparing for the Skills Proficiency Tests, we had the opportunity to study all eight SAFD recognized weapon disciplines. We also got to experience some enlightening and challenging master classes featuring various martial arts, sword and cloak, sword and poniard, gun slinging, and a master class in film fighting with Fight Master Emeritus and SAFD Co-Founder, David Boushey. In short, all three weeks were worth every second, every strained muscle, and every drop of sweat.



I felt the need to share these reflections on the NSCW for a couple of reasons. First, I strongly believe all members of the SAFD should attend this workshop, not only because it helps to become a better fighter; but also, and perhaps more importantly, it can enhance the sense of community and thus strengthen the SAFD as a whole. Second, I feel I have witnessed my fair share of theater with stage violence that appeared empty or absurd. The NSCW, with its emphasis on specificity and dramatic effect, is an opportunity to affect the industry and provide audiences with intention-driven story telling.

These are just a few thoughts I've felt compelled to share after three weeks with so many stalwart individuals. For my brothers and sisters of the SAFD who have yet to experience the wonders of the NSCW, I strongly encourage you to find the time and make the sacrifice. For those who have gone before and those who shared this journey with me, I thank you and hope we all keep fighting the good fight.



Friend Mary Barnidge has kept an eye on all stage violence in the Windy City and wanted to place special emphasis on the best work she has seen. She wrote: "Robin McFarquhar staged a SPECTACULAR spear-stunt for *Troilus and Cressida* at Chicago Shakespeare. Chuck Coyl contributed some nice domestic rough stuff to *August: Osage County* at Steppenwolf and Nick Sandys will be choreographing 17th-century Spanish rapier duels for *The Defiant Muse* at Victory Gardens Theatre early this fall."

This spring, CT/FD Jamie Cheatham choreographed I Hate Hamlet at Concordia College in Wisconsin and taught his first SPT at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, where he now heads the acting program. Shortly after, he headed off to Illinois to teach at the Eureka Workshop with CT Neil Massey. Then he staged violence for the Illinois Shakespeare Festival's productions of Henry V and Much Ado About Nothing. This summer he was fight directing Henry IV, part 2 at Milwaukee Shakespeare, and in the spring of 2008 he will play the role of Macbeth at Parkside, and will be staging the fights as well.

CT Bruce Cromer had his fourteenth SPT at Wright State University this spring, with new FM k. Jenny Jones serving as Adjudicator. He had just finished playing Prospero in the Cincinnati Shakespeare Company's *The Tempest* while directing a production of the same play at WSU simultaneously. He was thrilled to watch his son, Charlie, learn from CT Mark Guinn this summer at

Bluejacket and then pass with EAEs in Smallsword, Broadsword and Shield, and Rapier and Dagger! Mark's son, Jake, partnered with Charlie in Rapier and Dagger. As a newly promoted Full Professor in the Wright State BFA Acting program, Bruce continues to act professionally while he teaches. He will return for his third year as Scrooge in the Cincinnati Playhouse's A Christmas Carol in December; and in March of 2008, he will play King Lear in the Cincinnati Shakespeare Company's production.

CT/FD Paul Dennhardt reported that his professional activities have included the Shakespeare Theatre Company's productions of Richard III and Hamlet as Assistant Fight Director with David Leong, Milwaukee Shakespeare's production of Henry IV as Fight Director, Illinois State University's productions of West Side Story, Vinegar Tom, The Pillowman, and Ma Rainey's Black Bottom as Fight Director. He also taught Skills Proficiency Tests in Broadsword, for Illinois State University, and Rapier and Dagger for Illinois Weslevan University. Both were adjudicated by Richard Raether.

AAC Amy E. Harmon congratulates Babes With Blades and a fabulous allfemale cast on the Spring 2007 run of *The Girl in the Iron Mask*, a newlyadapted swashbuckler by RL Nesvet. The Babes also recently cast their fall 2007 show, *Horror Academy* by Darren Callahan, and announced auditions for their spring 2008 show, *Los Desaparecidos* by Barbara Lhota, directed by FM David Woolley.

CT Andrew Hayes co-led a session on theatrical violence and playwriting with AC Meron Langsner at the annual ATHE conference in New Orleans. He will be teaching independent study stage combat courses this fall at DePauw University and trying to close out his term as Treasurer with dignity.

Friend Kateri Kline-Johnson was Fight Director for Opera Grand Rapids production of *Romeo et Juliette*, and then went directly into two separate productions of *Oklahoma* also acting as Fight Director. She began pre-production work in May on a short Indie film, *Pirate on a Playground*, which she choreographed all the fight scenes and filmed in July. She is now preparing for upcoming productions of *Carmen* and *The Miracle Worker*.

CT/FD Robin McFarquhar has recently choreographed *Troilus and Cressida* at Chicago Shakespeare Theatre, *Hamlet* at South Coast Rep, and the National Tour of *The Color Purple*. Upcoming projects will include *Cymbeline*, *Othello* and *The Comedy of Errors* all for Chicago Shakespeare, and an all female *Henry IV Part I* at the University of Illinois where he continues to teach movement. He has also embarked on the three-year training program in Urbana, Illinois to become an accredited teacher of the Alexander Technique.



This fall he will be performing at the Ohio Renaissance Faire, teaching classes in 5 weapons at Columbia College Chicago (his 21st year as Artist in Residence). 


