Allen Rice (Rece), soldier of the Revolution, born 10/7/1759
Died 11/29/1837. Married Mary Clymer in 1780. She was ^{born} ~~born~~ in
9/9/1763. and died 8/ ?1858. Came to Cabell County in
1803, and settled on Mud River on the Jas. Dundas and Edmund Fry
farms, north of Blue Sulphur. He was a private in Penn. Mili-
tia, and pensioned in 1838. Born in Buck's Valley, Pa--Allen
and Mary are buried on Jas. Dundas' farm, at Blue Sulphur. They
came by way of Bedford County, Va., ^{Peaks of Otter} of welsh descent. Allen and
Mary had three children:

Sallie " " Nathan Everett.

Mary Clymer died at her daughter's Sarah (Rece) Everett in

Allen Rece had a brother, Enoch. He was in the Revolu-
tionary war. Appears on rolls as Private in Capt. Rob. Gibson
Co. Buck Co. Militia. Returned 5/19/1781. Enoch went further
south than Virginia--about 1783

Thomas Harmon, preacher at Union Church, was a brother of
Elizabeth Harmon (See sheet submitted as above)

Joseph Rece married Mary Harmon, daughter of Thomas Harmon
and Nancy Walker Harmon in the year 1806.

Elizabeth Harmon lived, at the time of her marriage to Abia Rece near the mouth of Scary Creek, in Putnam County. Abia Rece died from an injury to her¹⁵ back, having been run over by some cattle, ^{but} and lived four years afterwards.

Abia Rece was Justice of the County Court from 1818 to 1861. *Doubtful (see City Library) 1816-1861 Sheriff by appointment, Gov. of Virginia, later elected to same office*

Thomas H. Rece, 37 and Sellie J. Williams, 21, he of Cabell County and she of Kanawha County, were married on November 29, 1885, by Rev. T. F. Holt.

Abia Rece.

Married Elizabeth Harmon and settled on Mud River (Near Mud Bridge and built a brick house and ran a ferry over Mud River 1814, on the old James River Turnpike. The house served as an inn for the stage coach. (Abia was a soldier in the War of 1812) and also Sheriff in 1838, and was a Justice of the County Court. Abia set aside a tract of his farm across Mud River for a cemetery for Rece's, and he and his wife were buried there. This cemetery is known as the Rece cemetery. Abia Rece and Elizabeth Harmon had nine children:

The Loves

The ancestors of the Cabell County Loves, landed in Massachusetts, about 1650 or 1660. One of these, Harvey Love, came to Mechanicsburg, Beaud County, Virginia, about 1674. He was the ancestor of all the Loves in this section. He married a Miss Giles, and they were said to have been the parents of four sons, and four daughters. The latter are not named, but the sons were Charles, Allen, William and Daniel Love. Previous to 1814, ^{and his two} Charles Love, sons, William and Daniel, moved to Big Sandy River in what is now Wayne County, West Virginia.

In 1814, ^{the three brothers (?)} Charles, ^{and his two} William, and Daniel moved to Mud River near Ona, to what is still known as the William Love farm.

-- THE RECES --

The ancestor of the Rece family in Cabell County was Allen Rece, born in Brooks ~~xxx~~ County, Pennsylvania October 7, 1759. He married Mary Clymer, born September 9, 1763; died 1848. (The census of 1850 shows Mary Rece as living, and 86 years old at that time. She, also, was a native of Pennsylvania. The date of their marriage was 1780. He had a brother, Enoch Rece; and both of them served in the Revolutionary War on the American side. The Reces were Scotch-Irish. For his Revolutionary services I am indebted to mostly to Mr. Frank L. Burdette, now deceased.

"He enlisted early in the war for three months services, as a wagoner under Captain Groves, or Grover (?). Colonel Proctor, State of Pennsylvania enlisted in 1777 for one months service as private under Captain Singer. Colonel Irwin, State of Pennsylvania enlisted in 1779 for seven months as a wagoner under Captain Ferguson. Colonel Hooper, State of Pennsylvania enlisted in 1780 for three months as private under Captain Thomas. Colonel Robinson, State of Pennsylvania, enlisted in 1780 or 1782 for one month as a private under Captain Thomas, Colonel Robinson, State of Pennsylvania". He died Nov. 29, 1837, of paralysis.

About the close of the Revolutionary War he moved from Pennsylvania to Bedford County, Virginia, where Alva Rece was born ^{Mrs.} ~~Wm.~~ W.H. Hagan says, Botetourt County. He came from Bedford County to the mouth of Kelly's Creek in 1791, where he settled and lived for awhile with William Morris, Sr., who had built Fort Morris as a protection against the Indians. He stayed there four or five years and then came to Teay's Valley about 1797; and about 1803 or 1804 he came to Cabell County and settled on the Wild Cat side of Mud River, about half a mile below the Watson farm. He, assisted by his son Joseph Rece, bought the farm known later as the James Dundas farm, about a mile and a quarter north of Blue Sulphur Springs. He received a pension from the United States in 1833.

He, and his wife were Charter Members of the Mud River Baptist Church, and he served as Deacon. Their names appear first upon the list.

Charles A. Rece said: I was born Oct. 27, 1837, in the old brick at the bridge. I married Miss Jane Pulley, of Jessamine County, ~~Virginia~~ Kentucky. She died in 1910. I reside with Ernest Hodge, 1109 Madison Avenue, Huntington, W. Va. I served in Company "D" of the 8th Virginia Cavalry. This company, as Company E, was enrolled from the Counties of Cabell, Putnam, Wayne and Mason. (See Border Rangers for a further account of them). I believe that Jeff Hunter and I are the only survivors of Company "D".

Most of the early Reeces are buried at the Rece Cemetary near Mud Bridge.

About 100 are buried in another old cemetery about one hundred to two hundred yards north of the Rece Graveyard. Joshua Morris is buried in it".

"My father, Edmund C. Rece, was Captain of a Company at the muster rolls. A Mr. McGinnis was the Colonel. He was succeeded, I believe, by Colonel Mansfield. I think that Mansfield was way laid and killed in Putnam County, probably about Trace Fork".

"Edmund C. Rece built the frame for the Doolittle Mill in 1847; but a mill was there long before that time. He was a regular carpenter, but he also made coffins and during his life he made over five hundred of them. They cost from \$2.50 to \$10.00, much depending upon the workmanship, materials and lining. Some of them were lined with Canton flannel; others with black velvet. He furnished fine cords; and, in later years, a box. He learned his trade under a furniture maker named "Maloney" and was with him several months."

"Both my Grandfathers, Abia Rece and William Love, and Daniel Love, served in the War of 1812. A man named Wallace of Cabell County, an Everett, and an Adkins also served in this war. Edmund Rece was Clerk at Union Church".

"Before coming to Mud Bridge Abia Rece kept a ferry about a mile above the Mill Dam at Merritt's Mill. He also kept a house of entertainment there for some years".

"A road went up the Wild Cat side of Mud River and connected with the old road on the site of the future "Kanawha Pike" (Believe I have a record from a deed showing he rented land here--F B L.)

"The first settlers probably cut through a road this way about 1788-90" (NOTE By F.B.L.--There were settlements here a considerable time before permanent settlements started about 1800).

"Abia Rece sold his land here and moved to Mud Bridge, in the bend of the river about 1824. He employed Capt. Billy Simmons, a carpenter from Baltimore, to build his house of logs and lumber, about 1824; and two years later -3-

Mr. Simmons built the brick house, now standing. The log and frame house stood on the bank of Mud River, about 1/4th mile below the bridge. A part of the log and lumber house was standing at the time of this interview. The old State Road, as well as the Kanawha Turnpike, passed through the farm which was bought by Joshua Morris about 1824?). He was buried in Rece Cemetary about that time.

Abia Rece kept Inn or "House of Entertainment" in the old brick at Mud River Bridge until the Civil War. Charles A. Rece says: "He never sold whiskey (I believe records show that he took out license)-F.B.L) "He was a great church worker----a member of Mud River Baptist Church, both he and his wife, and no doubt, most of his family. "Valley" John Morris also kept an Inn about two miles east of the bridge. Teay's Valley begins at this bridge and extends East. Some of the Teayses, of Missouri claim kin with the Teayses of this section. Abia Rece's Inn stood about three hundred yards west of Mud Bridge. I remember hearing Grandfather Abia say that Henry Clay spent a night with him. He had facilities for feeding hogs, and other stock going East. Abia Rece was not a large man. He weighed about 155 lbs. or 160 lbs. and was about 5 ft. 6 in. tall. C. L. Roffe was a first cousin to my mother".

Between 1824 and 1834, Grandfather kept a ferry below Mud Bridge, but the ^{road} ~~ferry~~ destroyed its usefulness. He had a whip saw, but I was too young to use it.

Milton Rece had a store and a dwelling house across Mud River and a little diagonally west of his father, Abia Rece. He often bought pork from farmers, in trade for merchandise, or debts. The Federal soldiers took, or destroyed, his stock of goods in 1861. He built his home about the time of his marriage (1844), and probably kept store from that time until his death. Much ginseng was brought in from the hills; it was quite an industry in those days and Milton Rece bought a lot of it. He also had a store at Hamlin, Lincoln County which Marine Sanford managed for him. Milton Rece owned the land on which Milton is built: it was named for him.

"He enlisted early in the war for for three months service as a wagoner, under Captain Groves, ^{or Grover?} Colonel Proctor, State of Pennsylvania; enlisted, in 1777, for one month's service as private under Captain Singer, Colonel Irwin, State of Pennsylvania; enlisted in 1779, for seven months, as a wagoner, under Captain Ferguson, Colonel Hooper, State of Pennsylvania; enlisted in 1780, for three months, as private, under Captain Thomas, Colonel Robinson, State of Pennsylvania; enlisted in 1781 or 2, for one month, as private, under Captain Thomas, Colonel Robinson, State of Pennsylvania". He died Nov. 29, 1837, of paralysis.*

About the close of the Revolutionary War, he moved from Pennsylvania, to Bedford County, Virginia, where Abia Rice was born (Mrs. W. H. Hooper, a cousin of the above).

The Census of 1950, shows Mary Rice as being 86 yrs old.

He came from Bedford County to the mouth of Kelly's Creek, in 1791, where he settled and lived for a while with William Morris Sr., who had built Fort Morris, as a protection against the Indians. He staid ^{there} four or five years, and then came to Leays Valley about 1797, and about 1803-4, came to Cabell County, and settled on the Wild Cat side of Mud River about half a mile below the Watson farm, later known as the Edwards farm. He assisted by his son Joseph Rice, bought the farm known later as the James Dundas farm, about a mile and a quarter north of Blue Sulphur Springs. He received a pension from the United States, in 1833.

He and his wife were charter members of the Mud River Baptist Church, and he served as deacon. Their names appear first upon the list.

Charles A. Rice said:

I was born, Oct. 27, 1837, in the old brick at the bridge. I married Miss Mary Jane Pulley, of Jessamine County, Kentucky. She died in 1910. I reside with Ernest Hodge 1109, Madison Avenue, Huntington. I served in Company D. of the 8th Virginia Cavalry. This company, as Company E. was enrolled from the counties of Cabell, Putnam, Wayne, and Mason, ~~and~~ (See "Border Rangers for a further account of them.) I believe, that I and Jeff Hubler of Little Guyandotte Creek, are the only survivors of Company D."

"Most of the early Rices are buried at the Rice Cemetery near Mud Bridge about 100 persons are buried in another old cemetery about one to two hundred yards north of the Rice graveyard. Joshua Morris is buried in it."

My father Edmund C. Rice was Captain of a company, at the muster rolls. A Mr. McGinnis was Colonel. He was succeeded, I believe, by Col. Mansfield. I think Mansfield was waylaid and killed in Putnam County, probably about Trace Fork."

"Edmund C. Rice built the frame for the Doolittle Mill, in 1847, but there was a mill there long before that.

"He was a regular carpenter, but he also made coffins, and during his life, he made over five hundred of them. They cost from \$2⁵⁰ to \$10⁰⁰, much depending on the workmanship, materials, and lining. Some of them were lined with Canton flannel, and others with black velvet. He furnished five cords, and in later years, a box. He learned his trade under a furniture maker named Maloué, and was with him several months."

"Both my grandfathers, Abia Rice and William Love, ^{and Daniel Love} served in the War of 1812. A man named Wallace of Cabell County, an Everett, and an Adkins also served in this war.

"Edmund Rice was clerk at Union Church."

"Before coming to Mud Bridge, Abia
Ree kept a ferry about a mile above
the mill dam at Merritt's Mill. He also
kept a house of entertainment there for
some years."

"A road went up the Wild Cat
side of Mud River, and connected with
the old road on the site of the future
Kanawha Pike." (I believe I have a
record from a deed showing he rented
land here - F. B. L.)

"The first settlers probably cut
through a road this way, about 1788-90."
(Note by F. B. L. - There were settlements

"Abia Ree sold his land here

Abia Rice kept inn or "house of entertainment", in the old brick at Mud River Bridge, until the Civil War. Charles A. Rice says: "He never sold whiskey (I believe records show that he took out license-F.B.L.) He was a great church worker - a member of Mud River Baptist Church. Both he and his wife, and no doubt most of his family. "Valley" John Morris also kept an inn about two miles east of the bridge. Teays Valley begins at this bridge, ^{and extends east.} Some of the Teayses of Missouri claim kin with the Teayses of this section.

Abia Rice's inn stood about three hundred yards west of Mud Bridge. I remember hearing Grandfather Abia say that Henry Clay spent a night with him. He had facilities for feeding hogs, and other stock going east. Abia Rice was not a large man. He weighed about 155 or 160 lbs., and was about 5 ft. 11 inches tall.

C. L. Roffe was a first cousin to my mother.

Between 1824 and 1834, Grandfather kept a ferry below Mud Bridge, but the ferry destroyed its usefulness. He had a whipsaw, but I was too young to use it.

Milton Rice had a store and a dwelling house, across Mud River, and a little diagonally west of his father, Abia Rice. He often bought pork of farmers, in trade for merchandise or debts. The Federal soldiers took or destroyed his stock (of goods), in 1861. He built his home about the time of his marriage (1844), and probably kept store from that time till his death. Much ginseng was brought in from the hills. It was quite an industry in those days, and Milton Rice bought a lot of it. He also had a store at ~~the~~ Hamlin, Lincoln County. Marine Sanford managed it for him. Milton Rice owned the land on which Milton was built. It was named for him.

These calls are magnetic, being taken with a pocket compass. However, the beech and Black walnut are still standing, although the black walnut is dead. and an old fence appears to have been built on these lines. The posts have almost all disappeared, and the corner stones appear to have been dug out by road workers. There is no sign of barbed wire except from the blackwalnut to the road, which appears in good shape. There is no sign of fence between the two cemeteries, from the beech to the black walnut. The line around ~~the~~ the cemetary is 954 ft. 57.8 rods.

A James Rece died in Cabell County 6/25/1816. George Poage, Admr. (C.C. Records).

Enoch and Allen Rece were born in Bucks County, Penn., of Welsh descent, and in 1780 Allen B. 10/7/1759; died 11/29/1837. Married Mary Clymer, born 9/9/1763; died 8/ / 1838. A relation of George Clymer, a signer of the Declaration of Independence.

Allen and Mary remained in Bucks County until 1783. Joseph Rece, first child, was born in Bucks Co., Penn in 1781 on August 27th. died _____. After this they removed to Bedford County, Va., near the Peaks of Otter where the second child, Abia Rece Abia Rece, B. 2/15/1784, and died 7/13/1878. After living here until 1791 they removed again to Kanawha Valley, near Charleston, at the mouth of Kelly's Creek. In 1797 they moved again--to Teays, Putnam County, W. Va. when Sallie Rece, the 3rd and last child, was born 2/9/1798, and died Jan. 19, 1883.

In 1803 they moved again to a point three and one-half miles east of Barboursville (The James Dundas farm near Blue Sulphur, at which place he died of paralysis in 1837. Mary Clymer died near the same place (at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Nathan Everett, now the poor farm at Ona twenty-one years later, 1858. Both were buried together at the Jas. Dundas place at Blue Sulphur but were taken up in _____ and buried again at Fifth Ave. & Main Streets, Guyandotte by the D.A.R.

Allen's brother, Enoch, came along to West Virginia and Cabell County, but went farther south, and was never again heard from: it is not known just what became of him:

Mary Clymer was 95 yrs. and 8 mos old when she died and had

had three children: Joseph, Abia, and Sallie.

Allen Rece was a soldier of the Revolution, having enlisted in 1776 and served three months as waggoner under Captain Grover and Col Proctor as private one month under Captain Singer and Cil. Irvin, Jr 1779, seven months as waggoner under Capt. Ferguson and Col. Hooper, Jr. 1780; private under Capt. Thomas and Col. Robertson, and 1781 and 1782 under same officers. This by authority of records Bucks County, Penn, and Pension Dep't, Washington, D.C.

On June 24, 1838 a pension was granted Mary Clymer (Widow).

Joseph Rece came along with Allen, and _____ 1806 married Mary Harmon (B. 6/29/1782. D. _____ 1857) daughter of Thomas Harman and Nancy Walker; and sister of Elizabeth Harman whom Abia Rece married. Joseph and Mary had three children: Thomas, Martha, and Mary. Thomas married Annie De Foe; Martha married _____ Turley; and Mary married _____ Merritt. (There was a Morris Rece who preached at Mud River church, Blue Sulphur that, I think, belongs here). Joe lived across the Ohio River, near Proctorsville, and probably died there. They are both buried at _____.

Abia Rece came along, also, and in the year 1803 (12/23/1808), married Elizabeth Harman, born 1/9/1735, died 1/9/1861. and settled on Mud River, near Mud Bridge. He built a brick house, and ran a ferry in 1814 (C.C. Records) across Mud River on the old James River Turnpike. This old brick house served as an Inn for the stage coach line which ran from about 1835 until 1873. The ferry was run by John Morris, (of Teays), before this, and was known as the Morris Ferry. On

July 5, 1814 Abia posted a bond of Sixty Dollars with John Everett, Jr. security, to run the ferry, and on 5/27/1817 the ferry rates were increased.

Abia was a Judge of the Circuit Court in 2/24/1818, at which he was present, along with Jas. Holderby, Wm. Buffington, and Wm. Fullerton. Abia was Sheriff of Cabell County in 1839, appointed by David Campbell, Governor of Virginia. Bondsmen: S. Sanders, John Morris, Absalom Holderby, John Samuels, and John Laidley. Abia was also a soldier in the War of 1812. He was a Judge until 1861. About 1874, while driving some cattle, the cattle ran over him and injured his back, from which he died in 1878.

Henry was sent to Heidelberg, Germany, to college, but was "lost at sea" and was never heard from, again. Mary moved to West Virginia after the death of Mr. Watson and settled near Blue Sulphur, in the old Edwards house, about 1858, and went through the civil war there.

In 1873, she married Jas. Everett, near Union Church. She died there, leaving three children, Mollie, Alex., and Sallie.

On December 1, 1855, William Buffington and Nancy, his wife deeded to Rudolph Dietz lot No.10 in an addition which Mr.Dietz had mapped on the "east side of Guyandotte". The consideration was \$150.00 Rodolph Dietz buit a house there. On October 3, 1857 he and Mariah Dietz, his wife, deeded house and land to Henry C. Everett. Henry C. Everett was prosperous young merchant, a member of the firm of Wolcott & Everett, his partner being Lucien Wolcott. Henry C. Everett had married Dolly Webb, daughter of Col. Henry L. Webb of the Guyandotte Navigation Co., who by the way, built what was later to be known as the Bukey House. The Everetts were people of taste and of means, and they furnished their home, accordingly. There was a great, square piano in the parlor, there were pictures on the walls, books on the shelves, and everything which in that time went to make for comfort and happiness. But they had only a few years in which to enjoy these blessings.

in 1861 Henry C. Everett went to the Confederate Army. His wife, just how soon I do not know, but rather early, went to a place of safety behind the Confederate lines. After November 10, 1861, when the Federal forces asserted the not-to-be-relinquished control of Guyandotte, their officers made head-quarters in the Henry C. Everett home. Captain Henry C. Everett, his commission won in connection with a gallant record as a soldier, came home after Appomattox. His house still stood, but the

hospitality which he had accorded unwillingly had been abused. The guests had slashed the pictures with swords and bayonets, and defaced other objects. The soldier of the Lost Cause did not find the atmosphere of his own town agreeable. It was until a year after Appomattox garrisoned by a company of Federal soldiers. Feeling born of the war was high. Captain Everett, ready for a peaceful life, took his wife and such family as he may have had then, and went to Texas.

On November 1, 1866, the Everett house, which stands today at #216 Richmond Street was sold by John Alfred, Sheriff of Cabell County, for the satisfaction of a judgment held by Robert Stewart against Henry L. Webb and Henry C. Stewart. Robert Stewart was one of the substantial men of that era. He owned other Richmond Street property and his holdings had included the site of the Baptist Church. He had given this land and contributed largely to the building of a brick church building. That church, which stood where the present church stands, was one of three structures destroyed by home guards from Ohio on the day following the fire the soldiers set on November 10, 1861. The Buffington mill and the Robert Stewart home on the Ohio River, above Guyandotte, were the other two.

Robert Stewart sold the former Everett property to William C. Wright, by deed dated July 15, 1867, the consideration being \$1,250.00. On the day following William C. Wright and Sallie E. Wright, his wife, conveyed the property to Charles H. Hall, who paid him \$2,000.00 cash. On October 2, 1880, Charles H. Hall and Harriett M. Hall, his wife, deeded this house and lot to W.H. Hagen, who in 1889 sold it to W.R. Suratt, from whom it passed by deed executed by W. T. Thompson, Trustee, to A.B. Rogers. I first remember this place as the Rogers home. Fenton Rogers was the

head of the family. A. B. (Bascom), the oldest son. Tom C. Rogers was the youngest son, and eventually, it swas known as his home. Then, it went to J.W.Nuckles, who lived there many years with his pleasant family.

The record indicates that during most of its history the house has been owner occupied. But there were periods when it was rented. Mrs. John C. (Mary Poindexter) Hennen, was born there. The Dugan family lived there at one time. Now, the tradition of owner occupancy persists and R.S. Dawkins is the resident proprietor. Under its care it seems new again, and he says that there are seasons when it is officer's quarters once more. These are times when his son, Paul H. Dawkins, master sergeant, U.S.A., and his brother-in-law, Major Russell H. Cooper, U.S.A. are visitors there.

By way of explanation, Captain Henry C. Everett was the Uncle of H.C. Everett, of Main Street, who supplied some of the foregoing informzation when I went with my wife and her father, J.B. Cox, of Weston, to call on him; and, as always to ask him questions Mr. Everett will be ninety years old November 7th.

DIETZ HOME.

Another interesting Guyandotte home is located at 216 Richmond Street. It was built before the civil war by Randolph Dietz and on property purchased from the Savage Grant. The property was sold by Captain Henry C. Everett and was later confiscated by the Federal Government because of the Captain's sympathy with the South. The home has been owned since 1923 by R.S. Dawkins.
