## The Eggers Family

William Eggers married Catherine Morrow, in Cabell County, July 2, 1837. ~~The marriage record shows that he was 27 years old, and she was 23.~~

The Eggers Family

William Eggers married Catherine  
Morrow, <sup>in 1808, in Ohio.</sup>  
<sup>in 1810, in Ireland,</sup> in Cabell County, Va., July 2,  
1837. It is not known where he  
came from. In 1854, an advertise-  
ment, in the "Smyrna Herald",  
gives us the information that he  
was a shoemaker, and had his  
shop "one door south of Wm. C.  
Miller & Co.", in Barboursville.

The Miller store was on the  
southwest corner of Center Street  
and Main, hence, the Eggers  
shop was on Center Street ad-  
joining Mr. Miller, and in the  
building adjoining. The ad. stated  
that he "~~keeps~~" manufactures  
and keeps constantly on hand, a  
supply of boots & shoes of the  
best quality. He works the best  
French calfskin and Morocco,  
and keeps all kinds of findings  
such as linings, bindings, etc.

So far as records here show,  
William and Catherine Eggers  
had but one son Joseph J. Eggers  
who was born, in 1840, and  
married Elizabeth Jay, July 9,  
1867. She was born in 1845.



a daughter of Thomas Joy Sr.  
He too was a shoemaker.

Joseph Eggers was a soldier  
in the Union army, in <sup>First Lieutenant</sup> Charles  
A. Armstrong's Co. D. First Regi-  
ment, West Virginia Vet. Volunteer  
Cavalry. He enrolled Feb. 5, 1864,  
and was discharged, at Wheel-  
ing July 8, 1865.

He married first —  
Beas, by whom, he had a  
son, Wilburn Eggers b.  
d. , in Barboursville.

His house stood where the  
Guyan Valley R. R. crosses Main  
Street, and just beyond where  
James Brady kept store, a  
few years ago. The Railroad  
moved it a short distance  
to the present residence of  
George Brady and sisters.

John J. Eggers was the only  
child by the second wife of  
Joseph Eggers. She raised a  
girl by the name of Ella  
King. She married — Adam  
by whom she had three

children. Later, she married his brother, and they moved up the Ohio river

Wilburn Eggers married Belle Ellis, daughter of \_\_\_\_\_ Ellis

They had three sons and one daughter who died single. (Ella Turley who lives near Alice Ferguson can locate the Egger boys)

John J. Eggers and his brother, Wilburn Eggers, both died of Tuberculosis, the same night and are buried in the old cemetery, at Barboursville. John J. Eggers, was a school teacher, and a good one. He owned a little home on Main Street, later owned by Captain W. S. Spencer. John J. Eggers was born April 10, 1868, and died April 21, 1896. He married Victoria Knight, daughter of John and Margaret Knight in January 1891. Victoria was born Dec. 23, 1865.

John J. Eggers and wife had  
three children

1. Eunice Eggers who married  
Frank Stanley. They lived  
in the East End of Hunt-  
ington on First Avenue.  
Eunice died and Mr.  
Stanley went to Akron,  
Ohio.

## The Meehling Family

Charles Meehling came to this section, with his brother Jacob Meehling, and settled, in Ohio. They came from Baden Baden, German to the United States, about 1850. They were moulders, by trade, and settled first, in New York City. They came to Ironton, Ohio, then to Symmes Creek, and to Rome, Ohio, and settled, for a while, on Symmes Creek. ~~They~~ Charles Meehling then came to Little Cabell Creek, and bought the Cushing farm.

He married Magdalen Plulp. She was from Wills Baer. Her mother was a Miller. His mother was Nichols.
