Jørome Shellon was born Sept. 12, 1821, near the mouth of Bear

Creek. He married Maluda Messinger daughter of Micholas and Mary (Williams) Thessinger of Fall Creek West Hanglin and land around west fellis under lossely born! substial log house, in the upper end of the Town, not far from the graded school, The building would be con. sidered a very Crude one now, but at that time, it was probably as good as any in that section. a part of it was standing until about 1922, when il was torn down to make room for a new building It was made of logs daubed with clay. There were two rooms down slairs, and a large lost divided by a partition up slairs. There was a kind of ladder by which one could enter

either of the up slairs rooms. Pumpleins and snap beaus were often dried on this landing. For many years before the Civil War, Jerome Shellon owned and operated a race track, but this was abandoned on the opening of the war. In his early days, he was a blacksmith. This is shown by the 1850 census, in which he is classed as a black smith. He followed this trade for many years till several years after the Civil War. His shop stood between the residence of Herbert addeins and the school building The later kept store, and was the first post master of West Hamlin. His education was very limited, but he was a very intelligent man, and served for six years as Proseculing allorney of Lucola County, and later, was a member of the Stale Senale For two years.

He had nine children, but his daughter Stella Shellow inherited the land on which west Hamlin is built.

Mr. Shellow returned from The State Senale in 1883, but worn out with a busy life, year - Och. 7, 1883, and this grave is on a hill just outside West Hamlin, and very gener know, or care, that here lies the body of the pioneer seller of this prosperous lille village Some years after his death his friend, ferome lambert, who made and sold monner ments, made a small monument for him, but left it to others to place over the grave with the result that it now lies in a back yard of a residence near the eastern land of the Guyan River bridge, The is cuplion on this monument reads; 'In Memory of Jerome Lambert Derome Shellon Jerome Shellon Sept. 12, 1826

Seella Shellow, growing wired of Country life, traded her share of the land to a Mr. Robinson for a house and lot in Guy audolle. He came to this place, in 1895, and with the E.M. Willinson, land geg The land into town lots, and sold them, Robert a. Lewis became the purchaser of the first seven lots, builta home on one of them, and lived here willie his death, w 1925. He had formerly lived on Big legly Creek, and engaged in timbering and mercantill business.
