The first pretty day that we don't fly I want to have his picture taken soon so we will have something to hang on the wall of our home. I have some things that I got you for X-mas but I will.

Bring them home or send them  
later on. The mail here is -----  
up I haven't received any for two  
weeks, it must be the X-mas  
rush.

I've heard the songs "always" and "I'll  
walk alone" Darling and it's just like  
you said. I see some of the sweetest  
visions of you and me together. Gally  
honey I just get all weak in my stomach  
when I think about it. Gosh Girlie  
I love you well --- you know how much  
darling. I just gotta get home.

Hang onto your hat honey because  
I'm going to Paris for a week of leave.  
I'll be good darling so don't worry and  
maybe I can pick up some Channel #5  
for you, well ans soon.
