I saw ya doing sugary-puns? Well I sit across the table from Don Bachman. We don't have much to do during the days that we don't fly. We have been sitting around listening to the radio and making toast and our take fire. Now you should listen to some of the conversations that we have and we cover every thing from A to Z. For every plane that we shoot down in the air we shoot it down fifty times or while we are sitting around the room. Boy! "sug" you should hear some of the lines that we hand the new pilots that we get straight from the States. They shake like leaves when we take them on their first missions, but it makes them stay with us and that's what Counts.

We are eating "C" rations now and it tastes  
pretty good. It is pretty cold here now and I  
sure got cold last nite I reckon I'll have  
to put on some extra blankets tonite but  
I could think of a heck of a better idea than  
blankets if I had you here - ha. ha. wouldn't  
you like to know? Well darling it might  
not be long before I can walk things out  
in reality. I sure love you darling and  
I miss you very much but every day  
brings you nearer to me. Well ans. soon.

How's my little glamorous Daisy anyway today? Gosh honey I'm sure rushing you with letters these last few days but I'm hoping that I get ans. for them all. I haven't heard from you for almost a month and I sure miss those sweet smiling letters. The mail is SNAFU over here in the E.T.O.

Well sug: another day has passed and I didn't fly any except over England. Don and I went hunting this afternoon with a jeep and some rifles. We killed a few rabbits and some quail and then we cooked them in our mess kits tonight for supper. Now don't laugh Daisy it was pretty good but a little on the Crude side. We made some toast & Cocoa and then I had to wash dishes.
