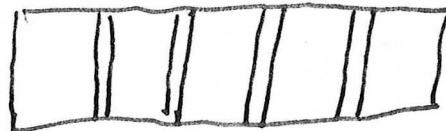

on that date from Fort
Prince George, with his com-
pany. Later joined ^{by} Cherokee
Indians, Major Lewis, and
companies of Captains Hogg,
Smith, Overton, Woodson,
Pearis, Dunlap, and others.
Left Ft. Frederick on the
19th, the Shawnee towns
being the objective point;
traveled via the Bear
Garden, Burk's Garden, head
of Clinch River, and reached
the head of Sandy Creek on
the 28th; marched down
Sandy for several days,

when finally being out of provisions, the men began to mutiny, and on March 8, all but the officers, and 20 or 30 men deserted. A.D. 28 pp.
