I get from you is worth a million

writing sug. Would you care to write
my letters for me? I will dictate them
and mail them to you, then you can
write them, mail them back, and then I
will send them to you. Yes, I guess
I am a little bit nutty darling. They
call it "^{FLACK}flack happy" over here. But
do you think that you could kinda
bring me back to normal when you
get me back home to stay? I hope
so because you sure would make a good
nurse. Do you do, every day around 6 I would
say "oh I'm so sick" just to make you love me some.
