The Florentine Hotel

It was built by G.A. (?) Mathews. He had a son Ezra Mathews. No daus. I went to it as clerk in 1890. Frank Horn was clerk & staid with him me. Later they had 3 clerks & I was on day service. When they had two clerks I worked at night. I staid there 12 years till Jno. Farr built the Farr, then I went there & staid 12½ yrs.

John Farr was one of the best men I ever worked for. He previously had a saloon before he built the hotel on same corner as hotel. Lee Conn had a ticket office in a little office in ^{the} front of the saloon. I came here from Parkersburg. The Gov. Cabell today is the best fireproof hotel in the city. Jno. Farr built it that way.

Col. J. H. Long was one of the first guests I registered at the Florentine.

I was son of J. M. Huff and Phiney.) Huff & Stephensons

The Stephensons lived at Beverly, Ohio
His father was a shoemaker at
Beverly, Ohio. I will be 84 next (1947)
April 19th. I was b. in 1863.

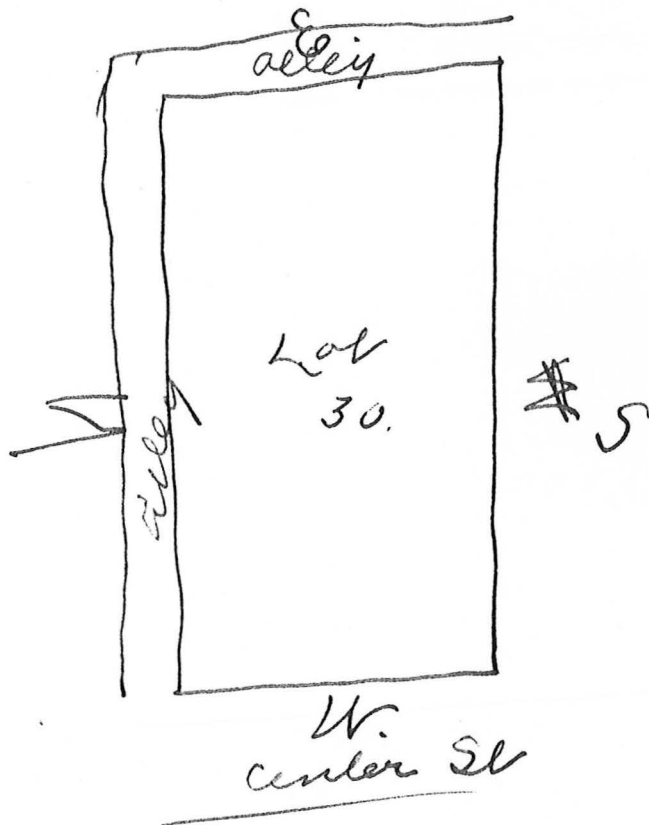
