Chair Tony Waugh called the meeting to order. Parliamentarian Becky Lusher noted that there was no quorum.

<u>Avi Mukherjee – Provost</u>

Enrollment

- o Orientation
 - Many speakers, students, prospective students, and families are here for orientation this week.
 - We want students to leave orientation with a full schedule.
 - Our orientation numbers were up 27% compared to last year. We had 1633 this year compared to 1280 last year.
- o Freshmen numbers are up compared to last year.
 - 35% higher enrollment
 - 30% higher housing applications or releases
- The goal is to have such a large incoming student group that it helps to offset the smaller sophomore, junior and senior classes.
- Overall Enrollment Numbers
 - We are currently looking at about a 4% day-on-day increase of total enrollment compared to last year. It will probably be less by the time the semester starts.
 - 5% growth for undergraduates
 - 6% growth for graduate students
 - Slightly smaller group of professional students.

- Transfer numbers are up quite a bit.
- 23% increase in metro students compared to this time last year.
 - Metro tuition cost was lowered this year to match the in-state cost. We needed 95 more metro students to offset this change in cost, and as of right now we are looking to have 150 more metro students.
- New Leaders
 - o Several deans, directors, and academic leaders begin employment on July 3rd.
 - Dr. Jerry Ross VP of Enrollment Management
 - Dr. Don Capener College of Business Dean
 - Dr. Maria Gindhart College of Arts and Media Dean
 - Dr. Wesley Stites College of Science Dean
 - Dr. Rob Quicke Director of School of Journalism and Mass Communication
 - Dr. Eric Blough School of Pharmacy Dean
 - Dr. Annette Ferguson School of Nursing Dean
- **Q**: Will the increase in tuition mean the dependent tuition benefit will also be increased to match the new cost?
 - A: The tuition waiver will be applied in the same way it has always been. It covers any base tuition, but not any additional fees.

Bruce Felder – Human Resources

- 12pm-3pm the following day will be the Juneteenth celebration on Harless Field.
- Monday, June 19th is a holiday as designated by the governor for Juneteenth observance.
- There are three paydays in June, so the last is a deduction holiday in which deductions for insurance and such won't be taken out.
- The salary increases of \$1350 for all full-time employees (or prorated if not full-time) goes into effect July 1st. Because we are paid in arrears, it won't be seen until our July 28th paycheck.
