The first deed of record to any Pullen, in Rockbridge County, was dated Aug. 7, 1787, by David McWilliams, to Joseph Pullen, for 150 acres, more or less, on the waters of Buffalo Creek, in what is now Buffalo District. The price was ten pounds English money, or what would now be the equivalent of fifty dollars, or $33\frac{1}{3}$ cents an acre.

Joseph Pullen Sr. who purchased land in 1787, and whose wife is clearly shown by deeds to have been named Agnes Pullen.

evidently was not the Joseph Pullen who married Betsy Moody, in 1801, and who were living in Botetourt County, in 1830, as Joseph and Elizabeth Pullen sold a tract of land that year, located in Rockbridge County, on Colliers Creek which is near Buffalo Creek on which Joseph and William Pullen Sr. lived and raised their families.

It is clearly evident that Sophia, Joseph, Elizabeth, and Thomas Pullen, as well as William Pullen Sr., and possibly Mrs. _____ who signed the deed from Botetourt County, in 1830, were all children of Joseph and Agnes Pullen, as all, at one time lived on Buffalo Creek, with the possible exception of Mrs. _____, whose marriage record I do not have.

The officiating minister at the marriage of ^{Elizabeth} Sophia Pullen and Joseph Pullen was the Rev. Elijah Vansant, while the Rev. D. Blain officiated at the marriage of Thomas Pullen, and the Rev. Sam Houston at the marriage of Sophia Pullen.

It will be noted that this family came to Rockbridge County shortly after the close of the Revolutionary War, but there is nothing to show where they came from. It is, however, very evident that they were brothers and sisters and children of Joseph and Agnes Pullen.

June 6, 1797, Joseph and Agnes Pullen sold 50 acres of land on the waters of Buffalo Creek, to William Murphy for 35 pounds Virginia currency. ~~Since Joseph Pullen became a land owner in 1787, it is very probable that Agnes Moody was his ^{first} ~~second~~ wife.~~

No further record is found of Thomas Pullen, in Rockbridge County. He probably emigrated to some other section of the country leaving Joseph Pullen^{Jacob William Pullen Sr.} as the only one to perpetuate the name here.

Death records show that William Pullen Sr. died May 5, 1854 of Consumption at 65 years of age. He was a farmer, his wife was - Elizabeth Pullen, and the report was made by his son John Pullen. This indicates that he was born about the year 1789. He was born in Rockbridge County, lived all his life, on Buffalo Creek, and died there. He was very likely the son of Joseph Pullen by a ~~first~~ wife, whom he married some where else - Agnes Pullen.

Elizabeth Pullen, widow of ~~Joseph~~ William Pullen, died May 20, 1868 in Rockbridge County, of old age, at 79 years, hence born about 1789. The report stated that she was born, in Greenbrier Co. Virginia now West Virginia, and that her

parents were unknown.

Dec. 12, 1853, William Pullen made his will, in which he named his wife, Elizabeth Pullen, two sons, William and John Pullen, and five daughters: Rebecca Pullen, Nancy, Mary, Leannah, and Charlotte. No record is found of the marriage of John Pullen, William Pullen, or Rebecca Pullen.

Records later show that John Pullen's wife was named Rachel, whom he married about 1850. Nancy Pullen married Thomas Ayers, and had a daughter at the time of William Pullen's will, named Nancy E. Ayers.

Mary Pullen married Stephen F. Wilkinson, Leannah Pullen married Lewis D. Hall, and Charlotte Pullen married William Glenn, Jan. 28, 1847, and most of them had families. Thomas Ayers married Nancy Pullen, Feb. 2, 1837.

Stephen F. Wilkinson married Mary Pullen, Sept. 18, 1839.

Leannah Pullen married Lewis D.
Hall, Nov. 18, 1841.

William Glenn married Charlotte
Pullen Jan. 28, 1847. (Repeated by mistake)

On Jan. 11, 1830, Joseph and
Elizabeth Pullen of Botetourt County,

Lewis D. Hall who married
Leannah or Lena Pullen as she
was called died about 1858,
His estate was settled Oct. 15, 1858.
After his debts were paid there

He seemed to have but
two children. The amounts do
not make the exact total, but
that is a matter for the ad-
ministrator to explain.

Andrew J. Deacon married
Elizabeth N. Ayers, daughter of
Thomas Ayers, May 5, 1856. Thomas
Ayers was present and consented
to the marriage.

Thomas Ayers died Feb. 19, 1882
at 80 years and 1 month. He was
a mechanic. His wife, Margaret
instead of Nancy indicated.

A death record of Mary E. Pullen showed that she died July 14, 1880, of Scorbutus, at 30 years of age. She was the daughter of John and Rachel Pullen, and this is the only knowledge we have of her. They must have married in another county, some 20 years before this John and Rachel Pullen lost two children of diphtheria.

Martha L. Pullen died Oct. 25, 1860, at 8 yrs. and 10 months, daughter of John and Rachel Pullen

Rebecca Pullen (named for her aunt Rebecca) died Oct. 25, 1860, at 5 years and 6 months.

Both these children were born, in Rockbridge County.

No records are found for William Glenn.

Stephen F. Wilkinson died about May, 1894. He evidently had married a second time as his wife was Nancy M. Wilkinson. He married first Mary Pullen. His children are named as follows, but nothing indicates which wife was the mother.

Lewis D. Hall died in Rock-bridge County, but the record is so dim that it is practically impossible to read it.

~~Thomas G. Ayers also died here but nothing is told of his family. (I believe I found the names of his children later)~~

() There is a record of the marriage of one James Collins to Polly Willson, Oct. 11, 1804, but since this was not given as James J. Collins, it is doubtful whether he was the one for whom we are searching.

There were a number of Collins families here as well as Hill families, but so far, no connection is shown.

It is possible that William Pullen Jr., grandfather of Charles Pullen married in one or the other families, but I find no record of him here since immediately after his father's death in 1854 when he and his brother John signed a deed for a Methodist Church lot. He possibly went to Lincoln County.

() John Pullen remained here but I find no record of his death. In 1879, he deeded everything he had to his children.
