The price was ten pounds English money, or what would now be the eguwalent of fifty dollars, or 33 3 cents au acre. marriage records, at Lexing tou show the following: Sophia Tullen married Beg (Etagaletta) James King an, Jan. 7, 1797. Joseph Pullen married Belly (Elizabeth) moody, aug. 6, 1801. Elizabeth Pullen married William Bogans, August 20, 1801. Thomas Pullen married Elizabeth Grove, may 1, 1809. Joseph Pullen S. who purchased land in 1787, and whose wife is clearly shown by deeds to have been named agnes Puller.

evidently was not the Joseph Pullen who married Belsy moody, in 1801, and who were living in Bolelours County in 1830, as Joseph and Blizabeth Pullen sold a track of land that year, localed in Rockbridge County, on Colliers Creek which is near Buffalo Creek on which Joseph and William Pullen Sr. lived and raised their families. It is clearly evident that Sophia, Joseph, Elizabeth, and Thomas Vullen, as well as William Pullen Sr, and Jossibly mrs. who signed the deed from Botetower County, in 1830, were all children of Joseph and agnes Pullen, as all, at one lime lived on Buffalo Creek, with the possible exception of , whose marriage record I do not have.

no further record is found of Thomas Pullen, in Rockbridge County. He probably emigrated to some other Section of the country leaving Joseph Pullen Sr., To perpet. uale the name here. Death records show that William Vullen Sr. died May 5, 1854 He was a farmer, his wife was Elizabeth Pullen, and the report was made by his son John Vullen. This indicates that he was born about the year 1789. He was born in Rockbridge County, lived all his life, on Buffalo Creek, and died there. He was very likely the son of Joseph Pullen by a first wife, whom he married some where else agnes billen. william Pullen, died may 20, 1868 in Rockbridge County, of ald age at 79 years, hence born about 1789. The report stated that she was born, in Greenbrier Co. Virginia how less Virginia, and that her
