The Bias Family

Records do not make clear the beginnings of the Bias family, in Virginia. Two of this family were in the Revolutionary War, Adam Bias, and Obediah Bias Sr., but it is uncertain which of these two was the ancestor of the Biases who came to this section. There is nothing to show the name of the wife of either of these men, ~~except to~~ but it is probable that they were brothers. The census of 1790, shows that there were five Bias families living in Amherst County. The name was spelled Byas, Bias, Byus, etc., but it is all the same family.

Because of the similarity, in names, it is probable that Obediah Bias Sr., the Revolutionary soldier, was father of the Obediah Bias who came to Cabell County, shortly after the War of 1812. I will, therefore assume that Obediah Bias Jr. was the progenitor of the Cabell County Biases. His wife's name is not known, but deeds show that the first letter of her name was S. This may have

been Sarah, Sally, Samantha, Sophia,¹⁰
or other similar name.

We will, therefore, assume that these two brothers, Adam and Obediah Bias were the immigrant ancestors of the Virginia family. If this is correct, the following outline will show the descent of our local family. We will begin with those shown in the 1790 census. Obediah Bias Sr. was not shown there, but the War Department records give his service as having been

Obediah Bias Jr.'s service in the War of 1812, and Obediah Bias Sr.'s service in the Revolution are given but little is said about Obediah Bias Senior's Revolutionary service, ~~is given~~. but Adam Bias Sr.'s service is given somewhat in full, and so is that of Obediah Bias Jr., in the War of 1812. Both of these will be given more completely, in another section.
