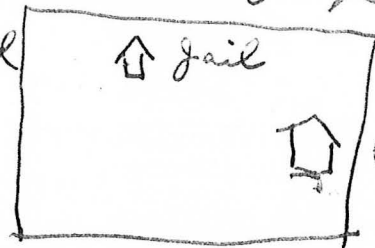
Prison Bounds

The round trip price was \$16.16 to Baltimore from Huntington round trip then to Washington Richmond etc, it was 18⁰⁶. As I go back through Winchester the difference would be \$1⁹⁰, and I would still have round trip Washington to Baltimore.

I found none of our people but all marriages from 1778 are properly indexed in two volumes for each sex. Easy to find, but the published early records are not so easy. I think I have finished all here. Most early deeds were burned in the Civil War.

I do not find any deed made by Isaac Smith to any one. I talked (Feb. 8, 1946)

later that this typed copy
extends from 1782 - 1830.
From March 2, 1782 - 1830.

The Second marriage book
(original in good condition)
covers 1826 to 1853. I later
find that 1779-1806 was for
"Surveys" not marriages, hence
1782 to 1830 is correct, except
it overlaps.
