It will be noted that these eye witness stories don't all agree. They militia were badly scared, and believed all the rumors they heard.

This engagement took place, on July 16, 1861, and was considered the second, or third engagement, of the Civil War.

The Battle of Barboursville

~~It occurs to me that you might be interested in some local lore.~~
 I have had a number of opportunities to obtain direct interviews, with people whose memories went back almost to the very beginning of Cabell County. I have interviewed numerous persons, born as early as 1830, some born in the 1820's, and some ~~born~~ as early as 1810. I have talked with many a Union and Confederate soldier. I have had eye witness stories of many events, in the history of the county. ~~It occurred to me that you would be interested in some of these events, so I have decided to give you a few of such descriptions. To begin with, I will give you some first hand descriptions of the little fight or so-called Battle of Barboursville.~~
 I will first quote William L. Johnson
 "Samuel Childers, long deceased brought in a report that Union soldiers were at Guyandotte and were going to make a raid through the country."

"About 130 to 140 militia armed with squirrel rifles, gathered in town. It was reported that, if successful, the negroes would take their wives, and carry them into a free state. Mexico Smith who claimed he had commanded a company, in the Mexican War undertook to command us. He made up a guard from Wayne County. We were in town trying to get breakfast, when he arrived. A false report stated that the Yankees were coming during the night. Robert Mays of Beech Fork was singing a song in the court house and Wash Gilkerson, also from Wayne County, fainted, as we came down the steps of the court house. We had slept on the floor, the night before. Fifteen or sixteen of Jenkins' Cavalry came down from Howell's Mill, and joined us in the fight which began twenty to thirty minutes after sunrise. Mexico Smith our "commander" placed us on the hill back of the Court House, and at such an angle as to catch every ball that might be fired at us.

Col. Ferguson of Wayne County came running up and said, "Gentlemen, you are to fire and then drop behind the hill, and then come up and fire again. Command yourselves."

John Chapman was the first man to fire, and Tom Atkins was the second one, but the Yankees, infantry in front and cavalry behind, came up the hill, as if nothing had happened. As they came across the bridge, a man by name of Samuels who was later killed somewhere, ran down with his squad of four men, fired and then broke to the left, and made a second round, and fired again. Then all broke and ran, and I decided to do the same. We went into the hills to the right of the Isaac Blake Branch. We were badly scared, and Ples Bartram proposed we divide into squads of nine or ten. We came up through the hills, to the mouth of Jones Creek where we crossed the river.

and ate breakfast at Colonel Simmons,
where Alvin Davis later lived. The
Yankees went on to Hurricane Bridge,
where Jenkins turned them back. Dave
Hick fell into the cut and broke a
rib or two.

Robert Mays, who was afterward
killed, was in the fight. My brother
and #3 Ples Bartram were taken to
Camp Chase and died of small pox.
Bill Collins, and two zouaves, were
murdered on Leander Gilkerson's farm,
on Beech Fork. Robert Adkins and I
were on Robert Adkins' farm, where
we heard the bushwhackers kill
these men. Collins lived on Madison
Creek. Eight or nine of us, crossed
the hills and saw two of them dead.
When we got in sight, we saw the
bushwhackers, in the blue uniforms
taken from the zouaves. One of
them saw that we were about to
shoot at them, and said, "Boys,
don't shoot, these are our men!"
He then told some horrid stories,
on events in the Beech Fork section,
killing wounded prisoners, etc.

John Rousey, a former County
Superintendent of Schools, told of reports
that the Yankee soldiers would kill
women and children.

Syke Bowen ran into a gutter, and splashed mud on himself and exclaimed, "I'm shot, I'm shot."

"Lucky" Savage saw the Yankees fix their bayonets, and start up the hill. He said, "If they are going to shoot butcher knives, I'm out," and he ran as fast as he was able, destroying gardens as he went.

John W. Barbour, who, at that time, lived in Wayne County, was about six miles away. He heard Col. Joe Mansfield say he'd die and go to Hell, before he'd live under Lincoln's administration. This was at Wayne C. H.

Rev. Stephen Spurlock made a speech at Keyser's store, on Beech Fork. He said: "Boys all go. If you can't get guns, use hickory clubs, for one Southern man is worth six Yankees."

Dr. Moss, of Barboursville, said the Yankees came up the hill, with fixed bayonets. He characterized the fight as a disastrous retreat of raw recruits, and that he could hardly say that "they distinguished themselves on that day." He says Col. Mansfield and Ferguson commanded the Confederates.

Ben Adkins of Bowen's Creek said:
"I was on picket duty, near what is
now the C. & O. depot, and had a
corner shot out of my left pants
pocket. James Reynolds was the only
man killed, on our side. Mexico
Smith lived on Long Branch."

"John Tessem of Ona said the
militia were under several captains.
My captain was Dick Lunsford of
Tom's Creek. Mexico Smith and Bill
Smith, each brought a detachment
from Wayne County. Dr. A. B.
Mc Simis of Guyandotte, called him-
self Colonel, and claimed to be
the ranking officer. Captain, afterward
General Jenkins arrived the evening
before. The Yankees came from Ohio,
under Col. Woodworth Woodruff.

I wanted to cut the bridge timbers,
but Jenkins wouldn't agree. Richard
Lunsford excused himself to go home
to see about his farm work.

Rause and Mat Templeton, Joe and
Henry Swann, and Alex Samuels were
in the fight, as were, also, William P.
Donahoe, and William Bramblett.

Pers Lunsford was killed. He was a
son of William Lunsford, and brother of Dick
Lunsford.
