REVOLUTIONARY PENSION OF W. VA.
CABELL COUNTY

Hezekiah Atkins --- Born September 20, 1759 in Goochland County, Virginia.

Service from Montgomery County, Virginia. Three months under Captain Thomas Burke and Captain George Faris.

William Lucas of Logan County, Virginia testified that Atkins served 3 months under Captain John Lucas, at Lucas' Fort in Montgomery County.

Also guarded two wagon loads of lead to Washington's Army in the Moravian towns of North Carolina.

Letter dated September 17, 1852, says Mary Atkins, widow of Hezekiah asks for pension and that Hezekiah died shortly after he asked pension, which was January 26, 1835. Letter written by W. C. Miller.

Letter written 1854 by Thomas Thornburg, still trying for pension of widow Mary.

Pension held pending further proof.

REVOLUTIONARY PENSION OF W. VA.
FAYETTE COUNTY

JOHN ATKINS ----- September 1834. Age 78. Born 1755 in Henry Co. Va.

Volunteered in the militia of Henry County, Virginia under Captain David Harrison for 6 months. Marched to North Carolina against the Indians. Stationed at Augurn's Mills Surry Company, North Carolina. Discharged 1779 in Salisbury, North Carolina.

Re-enlisted under Captain Thomas Henderson for 2 years. Marched to Guilford Courthouse and later joined General Green. After surrender of Cornwallis served in militia to guard prisoners. Here he was discharged. (Yorktown.)

Father's home was in Henry County, Virginia. Moved to Montgomery County, thence to Cabell, thence to Fayette County.

Pension refused. Reason given did not prove six months service.
