1. The Church Covenant

a. Art 1 - Summary of Faith  
and Practice - believe  
it to be in accordance  
with Holy Scripture.

Art 2 - Hold private & family  
worship, also assemble  
on the Lord's day and  
other days whether stated  
or occasional for public  
worship.

Art 3 - To attend business  
meetings.

Art. 4 - To promote peace  
Follow this - "If thy  
brother shall trespass  
against thee, go thou  
and tell him his  
fault between thee  
and him alone."

Art. 5 - To dismiss any  
one guilty of gross  
immorality.

3rd - Any member neglecting church worship - to be called a delinquent - to the him to be an object of church sympathy or of censure.

4th - Any one departing from the faith, or attending a "place of levitations amusement - theater, ball room, liquor, buying, selling or using should be rebuked or admonished - if not penitent "should be put away" - as "not being a lover of God"

8. Not permitted to go to law. Controversies to be settled by the church.

9. All such persons to be restored on showing repentance or reformation but this not to restore him to an office.

10. Elders, deacons, etc. to be chosen.

Elmwood was organized 1889; Membership increased by baptism 7; Present number 56; Pastor's salary \$125.00; Number Minutes 50; Other expenses \$1.53; Total \$147.00; Foreign Missions \$3.85; Home Missions \$5.00; State Missions \$12.00 Ministerial Education \$2.80; Total Benevolence \$37.00; Total \$170.70.
