- c. Over 750 students have come to the university, but over 4000 students were fully admitted. We need to get the other 3300 students to commit to coming to the university by interacting with someone in academics.
- d. A graduate Green and White day is being discussed right now. We will look at recruiting current Marshall students into graduate programs and promote the graduate programs in the region.
- e. The hiring freeze will remain until the Time dependent data; Delaware Cost Study data will be used to determine where faculty lines will be cut through attrition in each college.
