HISTORY OF THE GILL FAMILY

The Gill Family was from England and of English descent. Joseph Gill II was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Gill I. His mother's maiden name was Bluet. (This is as far back as we have any record). Joseph Gill II was born in 1810 and died in 1875. He was married at the age of 22 years to Miss Mary Anne Bailey, age 19 years. They were married just one hundred years ago from this date, September, 1932, and made their home in Birmingham, England until they emigrated to America in the year 1846.

There were five children born to them while they lived in England, viz: Joseph, William, Mary Ann, James and Charles. James died in England at the age of two years. After the family moved to America five more children were born, viz: George, John, Bettie, Henry and Thomas Jefferson.

They sailed from Liverpool, England in a sailing vessel, the New World. The ship sailed by the Southern route because it was the time of year for storms. There was a storm encountered by the ship, and they were about three months in crossing. They landed on February 15, 1846, at New York.

Grandfather Gill had already contracted to buy a tract of land on Little Guyan River in Cabell County. They stayed for six weeks in Brooklyn, N. Y. until the coldest part of the winter was over. While in Brooklyn Grandfather Gill and his two oldest sons went hunting in the woods near New York. As soon as the cold, snowy weather was over they moved to the land already mentioned on Little Guyan River, where they made their first home. He bought some land on Madison Creek, and moved there before the Civil War. The family remained at the Madison Creek home until after the Civil War, when they moved to the Salt Rock farm. William Gill was a soldier in the Union Army during the Civil War.

There was a log house already built on the Salt Rock farm when the Gill family moved to the new home. Grandfather and his oldest sons built another log house and a kitchen. They built a long porch in front of the two log buildings.

Thomas Jefferson Gill was married to Belle May in 1890. Eleven children born to them, viz: Maud, Bessie, Scott, Earl, Bradley, Edith, Ralph, Mattie, William, Waitman, and Virginia.

Grandfather Gill was a Civil Engineer. He helped survey the route for the construction of the Suez Canal, being gone from his home for eighteen months while helping with this surveying. He surveyed the Guyan River before the Locks and Dams were constructed. Grandfather Gill and Grandmother Gill were members of the Established Church of England before they came to America. After they came here they joined the Methodist Church. The Gills have always been a social family and they welcomed their friends and neighbors in their homes. Grandfather Gill gave a dinner as far back as the year 1870, to which were invited all the surrounding people for miles around.

All of the first generation of the Gill family except one have passed on to their reward. They were a family of noble men and women, and we, their children and grandchildren hope to "carry on" the examples set by our foreparents.

NOTES BY F. B. LAMBERT.

Hoseph Gill, Sr. came from England before the Civil War. He came to Salt Rock after the war and lived in the Patrick Keenan property, which, I think he bought from them. (Pat Keenan is buried is buried on Scites' farm. There is a Scites grave yard and also a McComas Graveyard) Pat Keenan is supposed to have built that house; and an addition of logs was made to it. The William Gill house is standing yet. The Keenan House stood across the bridge (Creek) on the opposite side of the road. A store house was run by William Gill (at first by Gill Brothers) Jeff, Henry and William Gill).

Ballard S. Swann born 1828 Cabell Co. Died Feb. 2, 1908 at 3:57 P.M. Married Nancy Keenan October 15, 1857. Had three sons and one daughter: Dr. P. H. Swann, of Huntington. Walter Eugene Swann, of Roach. He was born July 30, 1869 and married December 23, 1879. Died March 4, 1942.

Children: Hezekiah, and three infants that died un-named. Three boys and one girl.

He was ill several months and suffered intensely; but bore it with Christian fortitude. Joined the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1858 at Salt Rock, W. Va. The pastor was Rev. Brillhart. He remained a faithful and consistent member all of his life until death. All said he was a good man.

This Church was on Hamlin Circuit, and many ministers will remember his hospitality. J.R. Mullins, Pastor.

Anjonetta Swann born July 11, 1865, and married November 7, 1890. She had one son and one daughter Ollie F. Carl E. school teacher in Ceredo

P. H. Swann, born July 30, 1858; married Nov. 30, 1892; died March 7, 1927.

Frances McComas was a sister to Little David. Another sister was Ella McComas, who married Thomas (Jeff) McComas.

General Elisha McComas died Nov. 12, 1848, at 74 years; Ann McComas died Nov. 9, 1850. (They probably are buried at the Scites Place).

Grandfather was a great lover of flowers and trees. He planted many fruit trees, grape vines and flowers in the yard and the garden. Old people who can remember seeing this home have told me that this was one of the most beautiful homes in the surrounding country.

Joseph Gill III married Frances McComas in about 1853. There were seven children born to them, viz: Emma, Elisha, Mary, Cora Laura, Ellen and Lucy.

William Gill married Judy Heath for his first wife, and she died in a few years. He married Emma Westwood, about 1872. Five children were born to them, viz: Bessie, Florence, Bertha, Albert and Elsie.

Mary Ann Gill was married to John Westwood about 1860, and six children were born to them, viz: William, Amelia, Joseph, Eva, Emma and Charles. Lived at Portsmouth, Ohio.

Charles Gill married Louise Porter, daughter of Gerald P. Porter, about 1870, and eleven children were born to them, viz: Ada, Judy, Herberrrt, Wilburn, Victory, Jaruel, Essie, Myrtle Mary, Roxie, and Hollie. He lived at Salt Rock and on Union Ridge home place.

George Gill married Amanda Waters in 1874. Three children were born to them, viz: Carrie, William Watson, and Hezekiah. They lived at Salt Rock. All lived on adjoining farms.

John Gill was married three times, the first wife being Virginia Peyton (daughter of John, of Lincoln (?)). One child, Virginia, was born to them. By his second wife, Mary McComas, there were five children: Joseph, Oscar, Nora, Elmer and Albert. His third wife was Nancy Peyton.

Bettie Gill married Eli Midkiff about 1865. Nine children were born to them, viz: Eva, Laura, Alonzo, Carrie, Leander, Willie, Daisy, Neuton and David. Lived about Sheridan.

Henry Gill married Mary Ellen Johnson in 1886. Four children were born to them, viz: Joseph, Fay, Ada, and Lucie. Her second husband was A.J. Coffman, and there were several children.

Albert Fuller was the sole cause
of his father's death. He went
hunting on Henry Shelton's farm. Henry
saw him among his sheep & cattle &
ordered him off & Henry Shelton caught
him & took his gun away from him.
Shelton was a democrat & Fuller's
republican. When Albert went home
& told his folks about Shelton

"Phonix" Fuller was the cause of Wilson B. Moore's death. He had been going to see her after the death of her first husband — Gilruth. Steve West ran a ferry — rather he had a boat.
