Died 1867, about Oct. 12, or 13. He was buried Oct. 14, 1867 (Cash Merritt's wife might know his age) He died of flux. He married Nancy Blake; she died at 79-1/2, April 1, 1902 ? about

Rufus Barnett died July 1, 1935, at 36. She died when he was 3 years old. Hence she died about 1902.

Children:

Mary, who died at ten (See other book).

The old Court House, (Wm. Merritt's old home) was a two-story log house, with large, stone chimneys at either end. There were two large rooms downstairs.

My mother cooked mostly by skillet and lid; she had a No. 7 step stove, but seldom used it. Grandmother Blake had a cancer on her hand; cancer doctors cured her. John Miller ran the store at Music Hall. His wife had a cancer on her breast. He wouldn't pay the price, and she died. She was Sarah Davis (?). I have my father's picture. I think Ellen has mother's picture. Earl Baumgardner is writing a history of the Blake family. He has Granny Blake's picture. It is genuine. He lives above Cox's Landing lane.

Jim Cox, at Ona, was an old soldier near Ona. He married a Yates (See F.L. Burdette).

Bill Hall is only Hall living. Widow Jackson was a Gibson, of about Yates' Crossing. She married _____ Jackson, of Ohio. Her daughter, Mrs. Delbert Miller, lives at Yates' Crossing.

Three Yates girls married:

Burdette stingy. Billy Mills died before Os. My father got this place, 200 acres, of heirs. My mother married Thos. Joy, and he moved here. He died with some of his children. Thos. Joy was a very good carpenter. He had two sons and five girls:

Thos. Joy, Jr. lived at the Thos. Joy farm. The old house burned. He had built it, and then had a log raising. Young Tom hewed the logs. I never saw Jim Joy, Sr. Bert Jefferson owned the place.

(Mrs. Barnet) Thos. Hall was a good boy, but got to drinking and fell off a horse. Kate Hall was a good girl. The Halls were nice people to visit.

Mrs. Frank Barnet was daughter of Leonard Turner, who lived on Prichard school farm, first farm below Andy's.

Andrew Sheff, my grandfather owned the land. He came by wagon from Rockingham County, and bought the place. He was Dutch. Spoke German. Andrew Sheff married Mary Reeves, of England. He bought 300 acres.

Leonard Turner married Lucy Nowlan, of East Virginia. I think my father, Leonard, was born in Virginia; but the Turners, I think, came to Wayne County. Leonard Turner, at one time, ran a hack from Barboursville to Huntington. He was a brother to Thos. Turner, of Cross Roads. There were four brothers: Leonard, Nat, William, and Tom.

William lived, and died in Wayne. We never saw him often.

Nat married Cerilda _____

Tom " Susie Varnum. He was a farmer.

Tom Joy, Jr. was a farmer.

Nat Turner lived on the Peter C. Buffington farm, at Russell Creek at forks of Cross Roads, or near it. One of his daughters, Melvena Harper, widow of Carey Harper, lives in Huntington. I also think Henry, a son, lives at Cross Roads.

Grandmother Sheff came to Virginia when she was a girl. Her half sister came here and lived and died on the Prichard farm. She married Matthew Thompson, who died in Indianapolis, Indiana. Andy took her back to be buried. No children.

Leonard Turner's children:

1. America; died at 19; single. We had a Bible. It is among some of the family.
2. Andy, married Clara Houchin, daughter of William Houchin. A good woman; one girl, three boys, all living.
3. Joseph, married Mary Gwinn, daughter of Wash Gwinn. There were nine children, on whom one is dead. They live at Roanoke, Va.

4. Mary, lives in Huntington. Is crippled. Was a dress maker. ✓
Lives at 737 -- 6th Avenue. She has records. ✓
5. Lucy Ann, Born November 15, 1864. Married. Three children dead.
6. Eugenia M., married Geo. Wright. Lives at Hurricane. No children.
7. Geneva, married Ben Locy (called Isaac). They lived at Point Pleasant, and he clerks at Brown's grocery. Two sons, one of whom is married.
8. Ada, married Van (Buren) Carter. Ran a bicycle shop in Huntington, Carter & Turners. They had four ~~boys~~ ~~and~~ ~~two~~ boys. They live in Anderson, S.C. The boys died.
9. Henry, a bachelor at Anderson, S.C.
- 10 Matthew, married Nannie Wilson, a teacher at Barboursville. She had a girl and two boys.

2. Harold. Works in the Navy Yard. He married Mosella Wheeler, of Barboursville, W. Va.

Leonard Turner married Elizabeth Sheff, daughter of Andrew Sheff.

Jim, married Caroline Marsden, of England. They lived at Moundsville, and have children: George M., Maupin America, died single.

Diana, married John Rece. They lived near Fairview school.

Caroline, died single, in Indiana.

Millers at the Merritt Mill:

Huff,

John Merritt, father of George, Wm. Sheff.

They made one grade of flour and bran and shorts. Four foot burrs for both corn and meal. I used to help dress them with a pick; they got slick. They made lumber before my day. I was about six years old, and the old Court House was torn down soon after. It stood about four feet above this house (east). It stood east and west. The windows had 8" X 10" glass. Not many windows.

For Thomas Barnett, see
Pulham Co. Census of 1850

(Thomas Turner owned Turners Ferry, on Guyan River, about 1 1/2 mile above Guyandotte. One of the other Turners probably owned it previously. In 1856, Thos. Turner applied to the Court, for a permit to discontinue it. I think I have a statement, to that effect, from some old citizen, years ago.)
